## Labour Day Celebration: “May Day Celebration cum Potluck”








# Faculty Development Program on Tips & Techniques Of Research


# ORIENTATION FOR MBA AND MCA FRESHERS

**A. INTERNSHIP WITH BUSINESS ORGANIZATIONS**

**Objectives:**


- To enhance the classroom learning
- To provide training and experiential learning opportunity for students
- To provide an opportunity to apply knowledge and skills acquired by the students in the classroom to professional context

**Guidelines to the institution:**

- Each student will have to work in a Business Organization for three weeks during the vacation between fifth and sixth semester.
- The entire batch of students to be divided equally among the department faculty members. The faculty members should be the mentors and guide the students in internship process.
- The students will submit a report on their internship by the organization to the college along with a brief report of not less than 25 pages. The report to contain a brief detail of the organization, nature of business, a write up on the learning outcome from the internship carried out by them.

**Marks Allocation:**

- 75 marks for the Internship Report and 25 marks for Presentation and Viva-Voce examination.
- Viva-Voce shall be conducted at the end of the semester, by the external faculty, from among the panel of examiners and identified by the College.
- The Institution should send the marks to the University along with EA Marks scored by them in the VI Semester



On March 21, 2023, the Department of Management had organized an online orientation program on Internship. A total of 100 students attended the orientation. Our target audience were BBA VI semester students who are required to do 3 weeks of internship in any company as per BCU Curriculum. Mrs. Sadiya Sadaf D greeted the students and explained about the BCU Curriculum related to internship which carries 100 marks, 75 marks for the report and 25 marks for the presentation and viva-voce examination and later explained about the content and format for preparing the internship report which has to be submitted at the end of the semester. Later, Dr. M. Sudha, Head, Department of Management who gave proper insights on the internship, the purpose and objectives of the internship, why is it useful, how to select the companies, departments and other related agencies and that students must attach the internship certificate to the report compulsorily.

# AWARENESS ABOUT VOTING




## Guest Talk on “Microsoft Access”

Ms. Haneen reiterated the differences between


Psychology as a discipline, and mental health as a constantly changing state of being that has applications in practically each and every aspect of our daily lives. Ms. Haneen acknowledged the cathartic effects of opening up about one’s struggles with one’s friends and loved ones, while also identifying the limitations of doing so. The Department of Social Work, Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies, conducted a Guest Lecture on “Public Health”. It was a webinar for Master of social work students to gain knowledge about Medico-Legal information and to get an orientation about various diseases and their conditions. The first day of the webinar 11 April 2023, where the resource person provided a quick overview of human anatomy and physiology. The fundamentals of human physiology and anatomy were covered in the first session for the students. The students were able to understand the significance of having a basic understanding of human anatomy and physiology for medical psychiatry social workers. On the first day of the webinar, resource persons covered the topics of anatomy and its subdivisions, anatomical locations, anatomical regions, and also explained the body regions and anatomy of the human body, including movements of the limbs and neck. , also covered the topic of the skeletal system and joints. Dr. Lekshmi then moved on to human physiology and covered the branches of physiology, the hierarchy of tissue, the organs

and their functions, and the different parts of the vital organs: brain, heart, lungs, kidneys and liver. We discussed the nervous system, reproductive organs and the immune system. The resource person then developed themes for the seminar's second day that covered various disorders like coma, epilepsy, strokes, and myocardial infarction. Diseases of the ischemic and congenital hearts, arthritis, alzheimer's, geriatrics, and other lifestyle factors are also included. The diseases that were required to be covered in the webinar on day two included cancer, Parkinson's disease, asymmetrical gait, cataract, retinal detachment, glaucoma, asthma, hypertension, diabetes mellitus, and genito urinary tract. The above topics were covered in detail in the session. The three-day session was packed with a lot of useful information. The students and faculty members acquired a comprehensive understanding of the many different subjects that were discussed during the session. The topics covered will be useful for academic purposes as well as career-wise. It was a great opportunity for the students to get classes from an expert with lots of experience.



## BASICS OF AVIATION

The presentation was filled with a lot of information as well as focused on research on the concepts of free market, organisational behaviour, social network analysis and skills required for an MBA aspirant.





workers to be familiar with the technology.




## SKILLING, RE-SKILLING AND UPSKILLING”

The presentation of brains in various states of health and deterioration as well as those of the deceased was excellent. Students also had opportunity to hold and carefully examine the brain and its various ailments. The journey began in a lecture hall next to the museum. The neuropathy department personnel explained the students how the brain works. The pupils had the chance to handle and inspect many organs, including the brain, spinal cord, heart, liver, lungs, and kidney. The volunteers delivered a rundown of every sick and

damaged brain they had in their collection.


As students of science, they had the opportunity to investigate various areas of neuroscience. The students got to explore various stalls, including Neuro physics, neuropsychology, brain and psychiatric disorders, neuropathology, neurosurgery, clinical psychiatry, clinical psychology, rehabilitation psychology, and so on. Stalls like Neurosurgery captured the attention of students, where they screened various neurosurgical surgical procedures and dispelled the students' skepticism. The students actively participated in the games and activities that their respective stalls organized. There were stalls that mapped the brain waves of the students. As biopsychology students, they were able to observe, learn, and understand the theoretical concept in a practical, real-life context. The nervous system and its activities, which include the action potential and other neuronal functions, were screened live right in front of them. It helped them to understand the concepts in depth.

## EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO NATIONAL HORTICULTURE FAIR 2023, IIHR, BANGALORE

The MBA department organized an educational visit for the I Semester students (Batch 2022-2023) on 25 February 2023 to the National Horticulture Fair which was held at IIHR, under the theme “Innovative Horticulture for Self-Reliance”. The visit was organized by Dr. Dhanalakshmi K, Associate Professor and coordinated by Dr. Asokan, Associate Professor, from MBA Department. This fair was organized under the collaboration with the Society for Promotion of Horticulture (SPH); BESST-HORT, a Technology Business Incubator ICAR-IIHR; ICAR-AT-ARI Bengaluru and leading development departments serving for horticulture with an intention to accelerate the transfer of modern horticulture technology from lab to land, farm to fork, through startups and flexible design standards. The visit gave the students insight on the varieties of plant species available and which are not known to common people except the producers, farmers and distributors.

There was a demonstration on the usage of drones in agricultural fields, drip irrigation system and its process and innovative methods. There were demonstrations of varieties of vegetables and medicinal crops for import substitution. Varieties of leaf curl virus resistant chilli, carotenoid rich marigold, etc., flower waste cultivation, terrace gardening solutions for urban horticulture, cost effective traps for the management of invasive pests, production-technologies for exotic fruits – kamalam and avocado. The exhibition cum sale was on seeds and planting material, plant nutrients, plant protection chemicals, green, polyhouse, garden accessories, products of FPOs, SHGs and FIGs, Government, NGOs, Corporate and Financial bodies. Marketing agencies, Business Incubation Services, Food processing, Irrigation systems, Agricultural export Services. The stalls and sales were on Seeds, Nursery Section, Agricultural Inputs as well as by Government and ICAR.


# PYTHON PROGRAMMING
