




Celebration of Zero Shadow Day: Understanding Solar Motion







training in high-demand domains such as data science, artificial intelligence, machine learning, and software testing. The selected students will receive free training from industry experts, followed by placement opportunities in reputed companies.

The training provided under this program is expected to significantly enhance their employability, equipping them with the skills required to excel in the tech industry. The event concluded with a feedback session, where students expressed appreciation for the opportunity to participate in the placement drive and gain exposure to industry expectations.

University Exam Orientation: Guiding First-Year BCOM Students



On February 24, 2024, the Department of Commerce at Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies organized an orientation session for first-year BCOM students to prepare them for their university examinations. 



Guest Lecture on Power and Politics in Organizations



Outbound Training for 4th Semester BBA Students: Enhancing Leadership and Communication Skills





Weekend Wisdom Series 3: The Relevance of Law in Business Management





Virtual Industrial Visit to SSI Units: Exploring Entrepreneurship and Small Business Management



Clinical Visit to NIMHANS Brain Museum: Understanding Brain Functions and Techniques to Improve Brain Health


