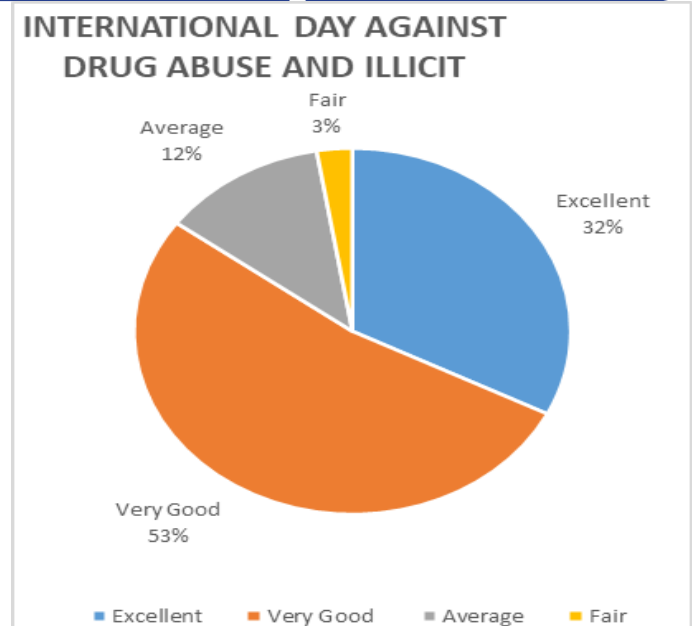

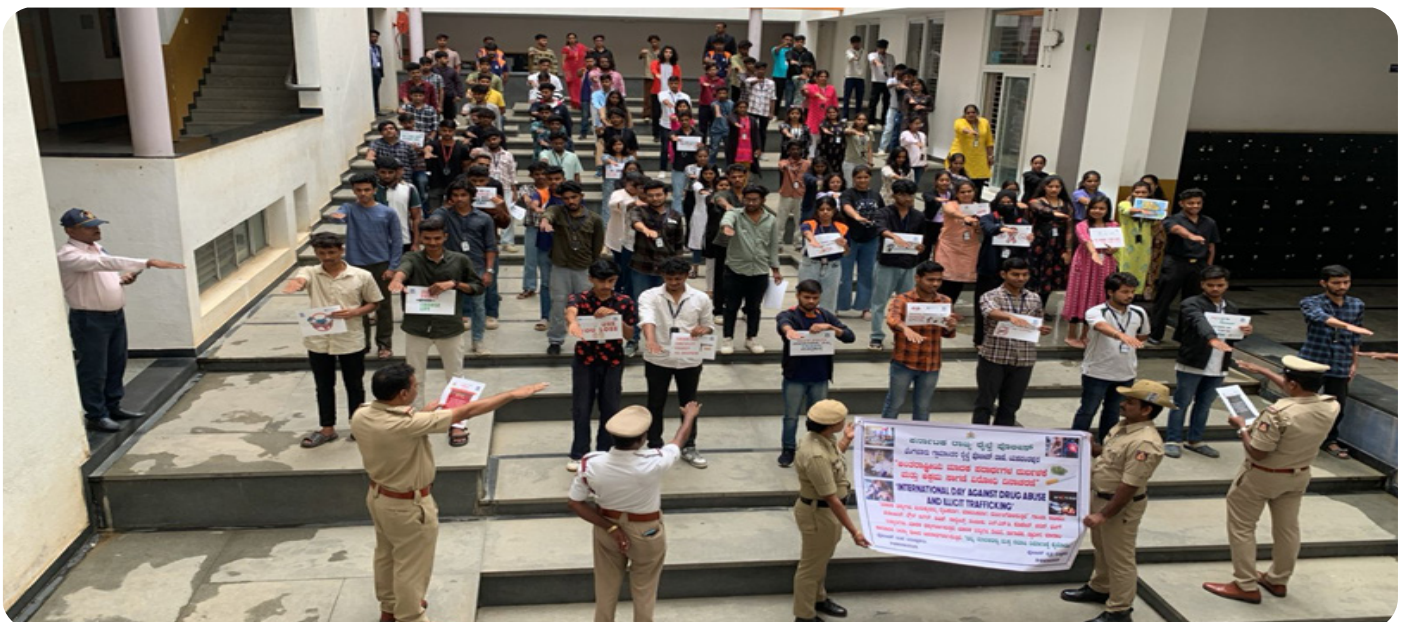


Awareness Program on International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking

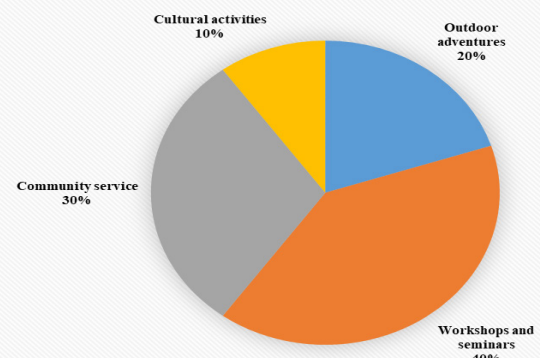


Socio-Economic Household Survey Data Analysis

26th August 2024



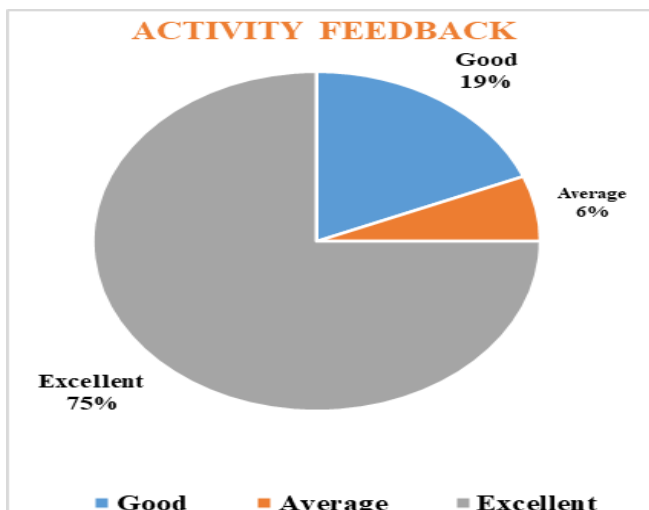

In conclusion, the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan awareness program was an effective effort to promote environmental responsibility and create a cleaner, healthier village community.

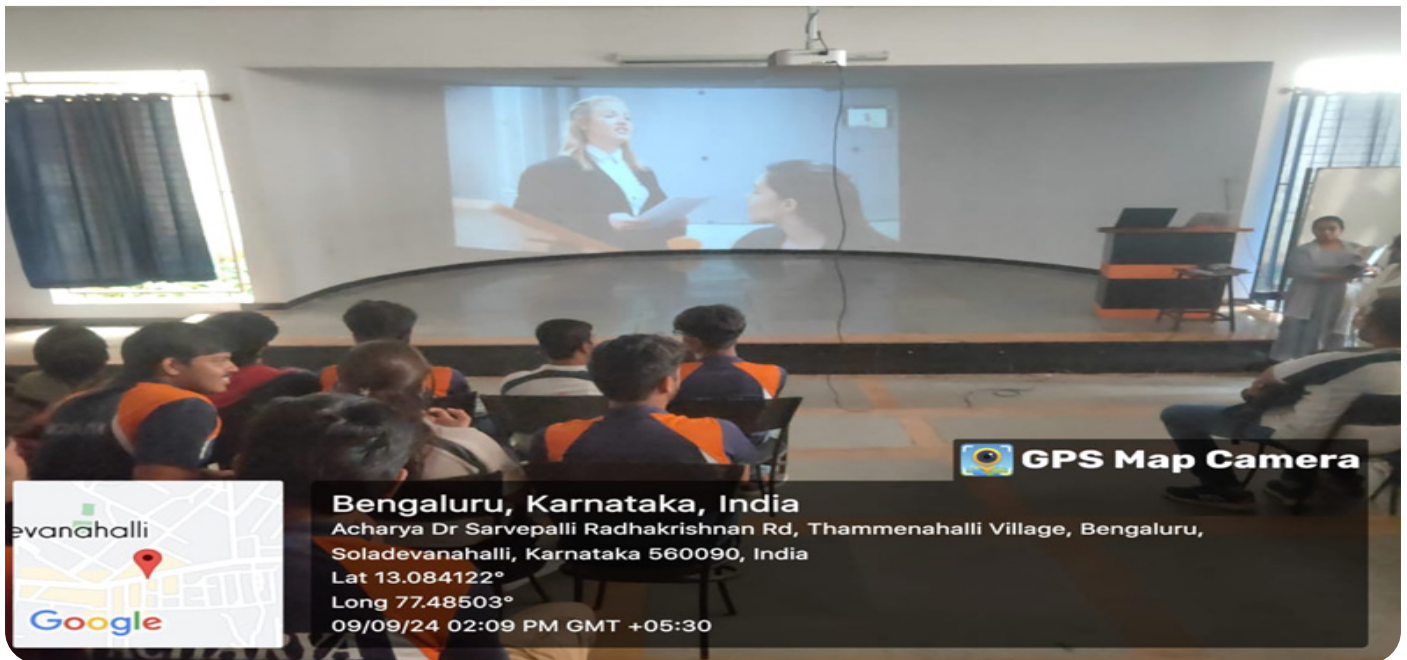


NCC Organizational Recruitment 21st August 2024

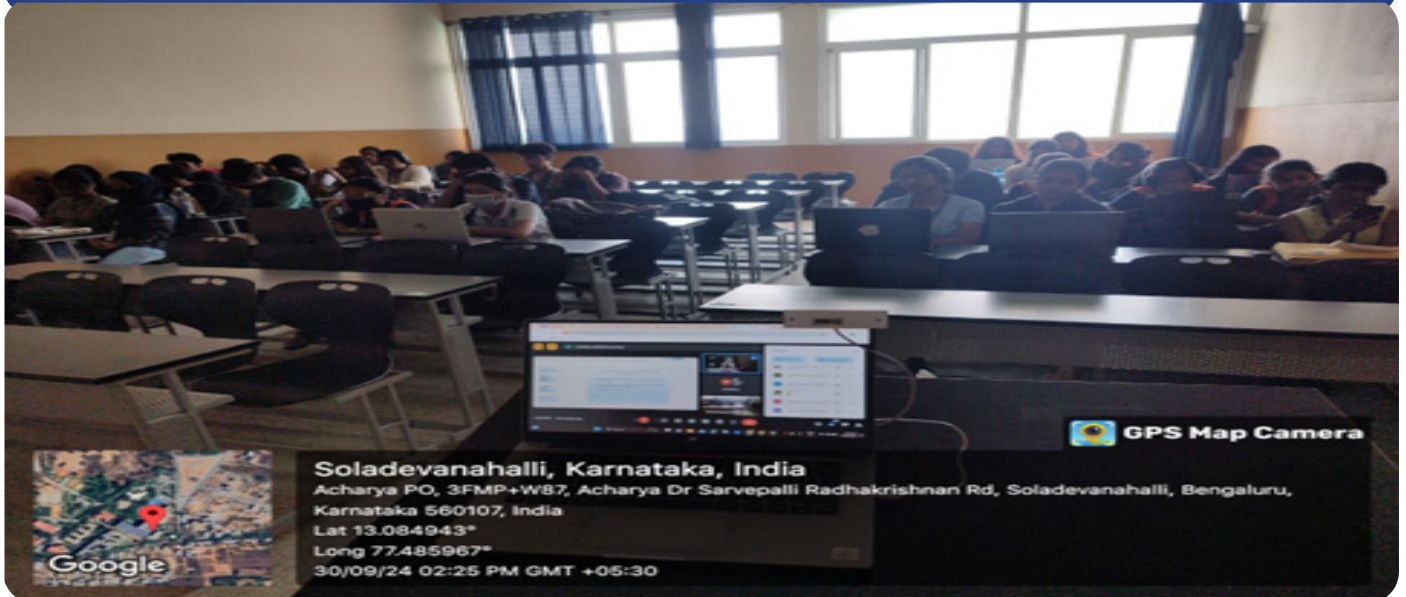
International Webinar on Master Class in Data Science or Cyber Security – Department of BCA (19th September 2024)



Online Webinar Session

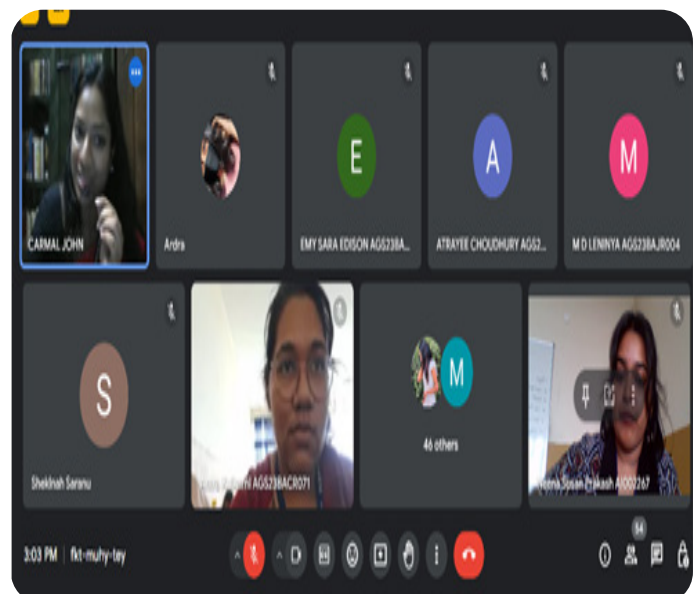

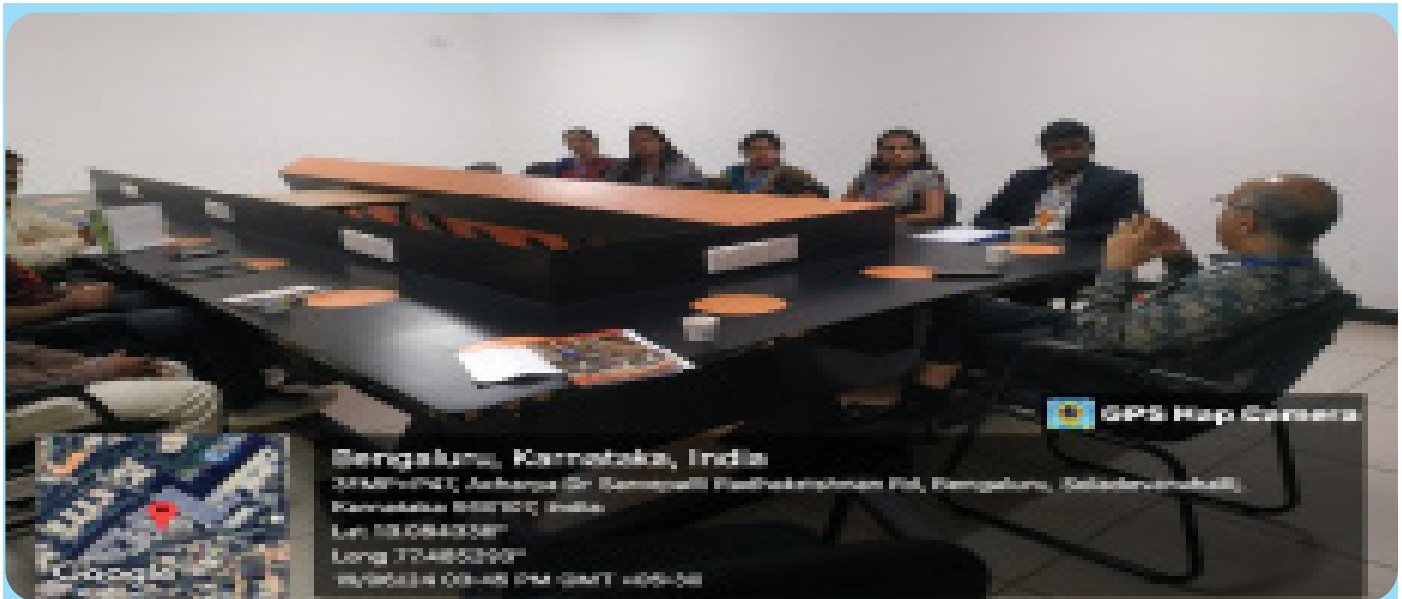

13th & 19th August 2024

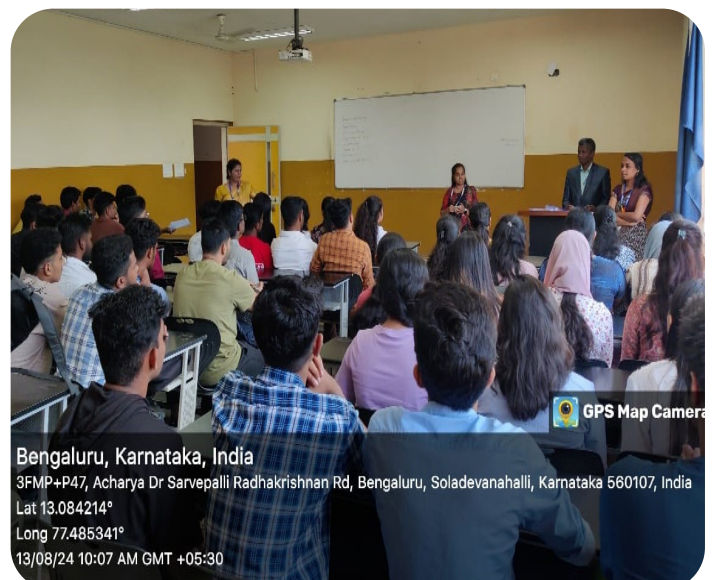

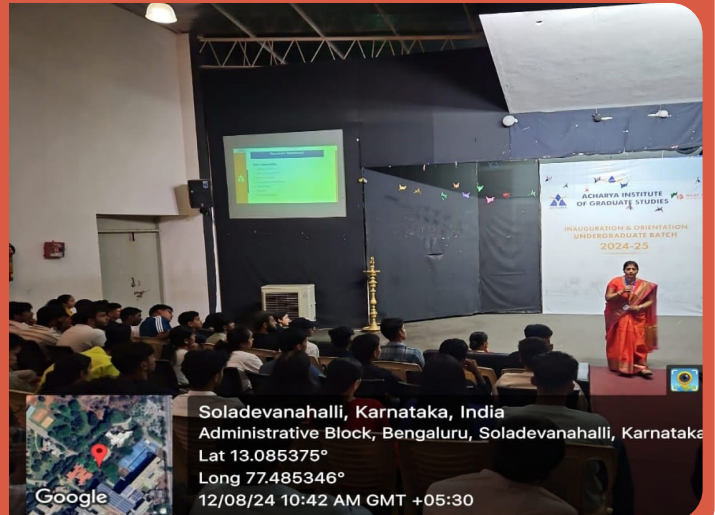
provides guidance and support for female students. Students were also introduced to the various student clubs, including the Cultural and Sports Committees, where they can explore their interests outside the classroom.

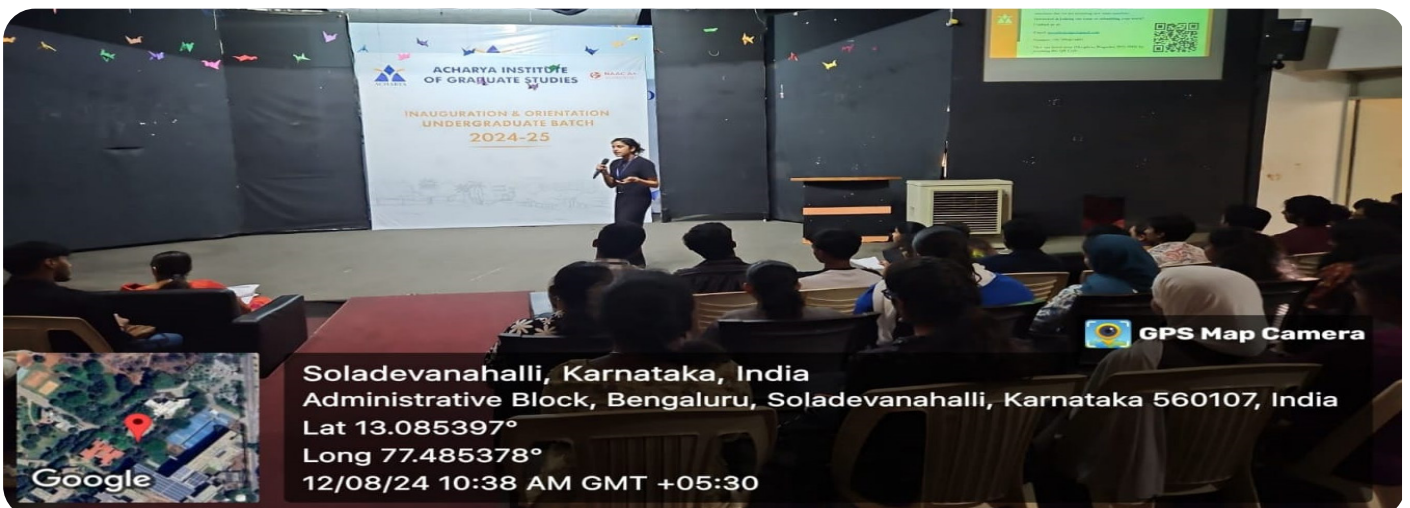

course schedule, and assessment methods. A cultural performance by students added an interactive element, helping newcomers feel part of the AIGS community.

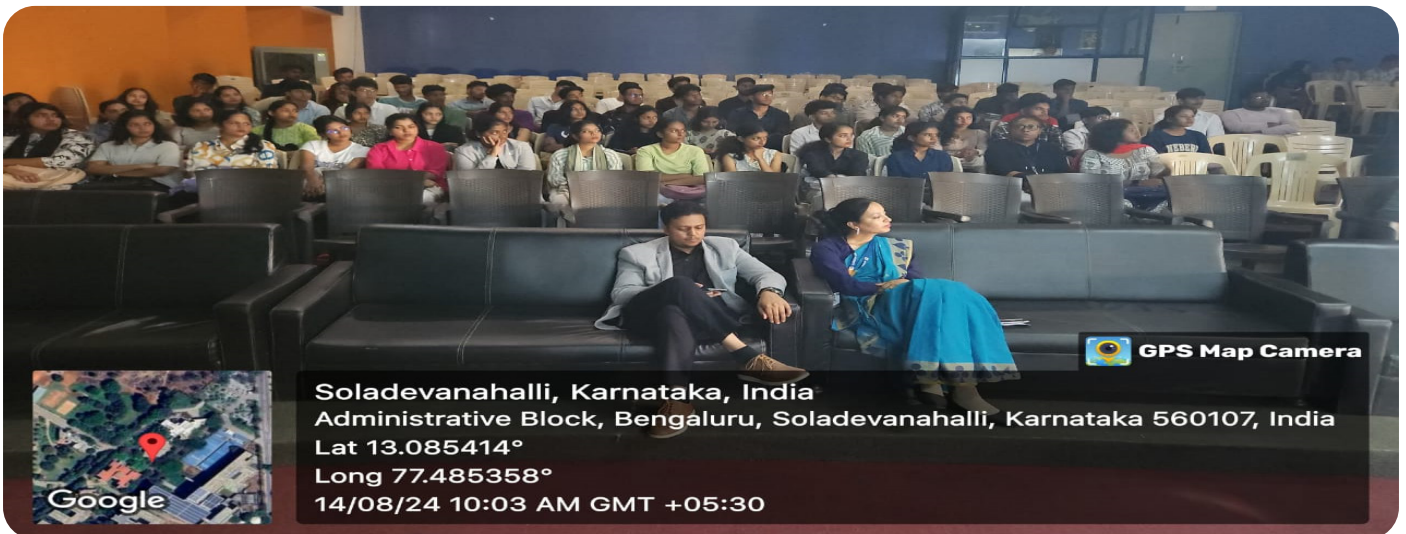

Orientation on Alive for B.Com Students



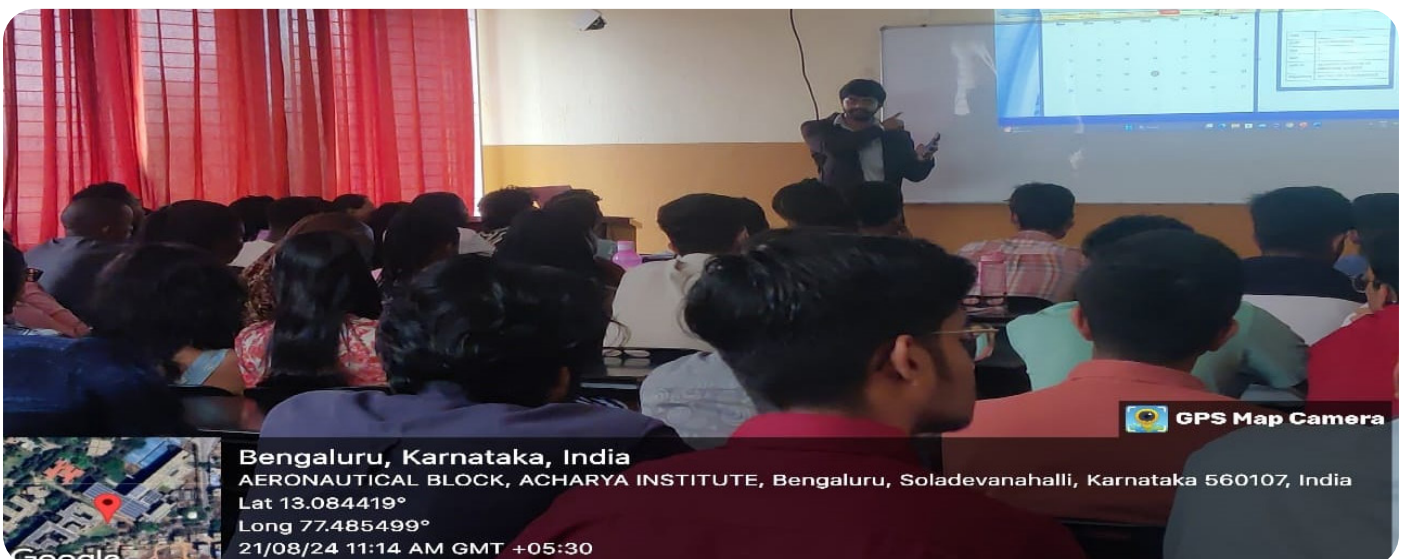

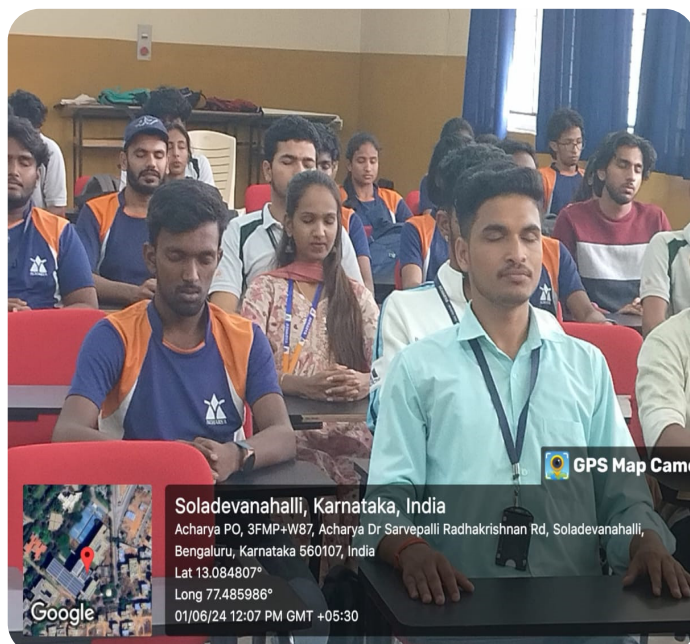


Seminar on Mental Health and Stress Management

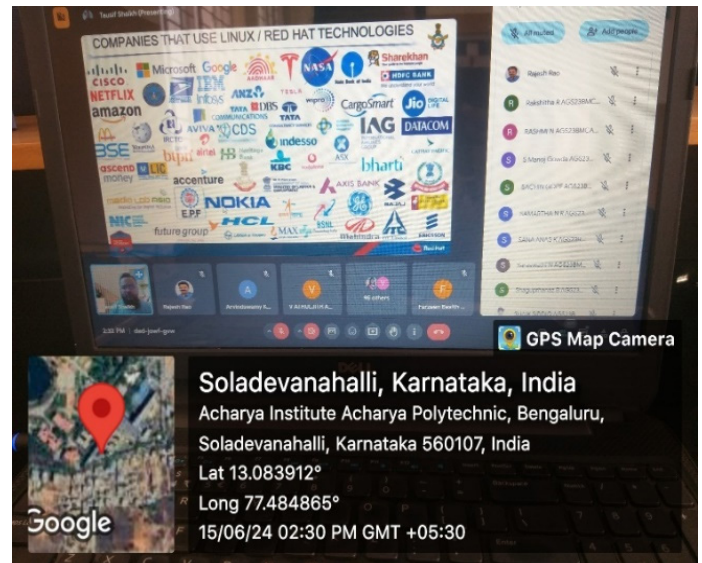


Webinar on Red Hat Course & Certification

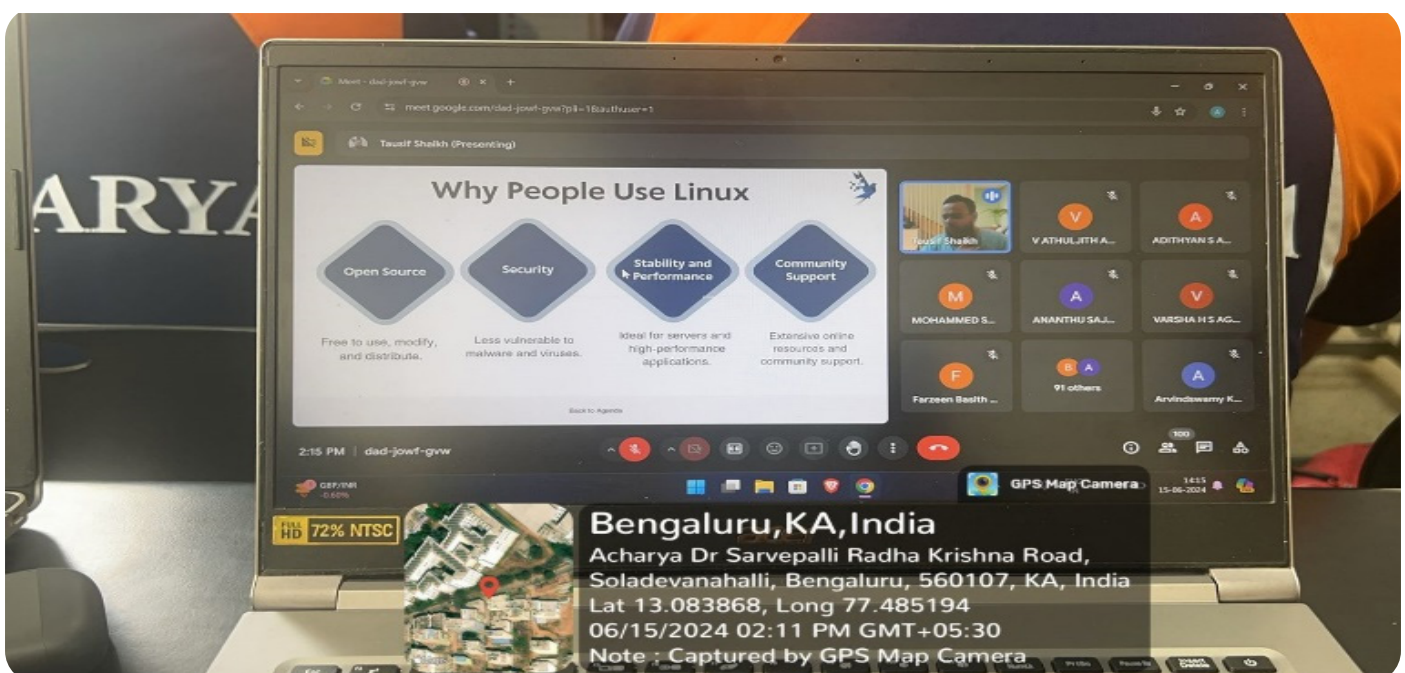

Webinar on Electronic Human Resource Management (e-HRM)

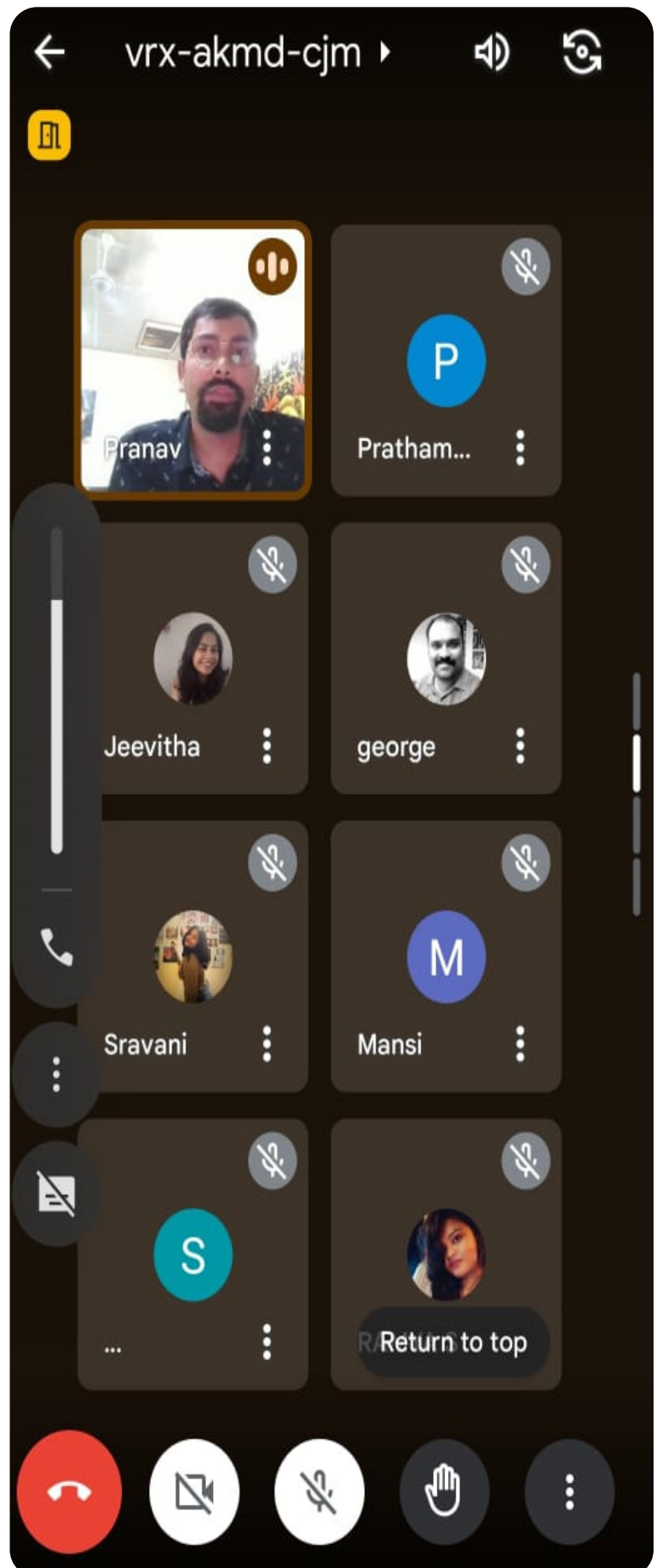

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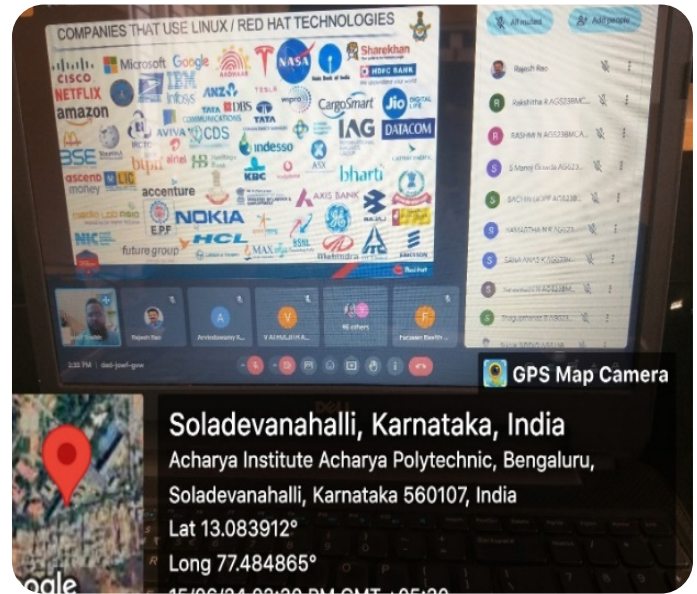
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Career Recharge Program by Salesforce

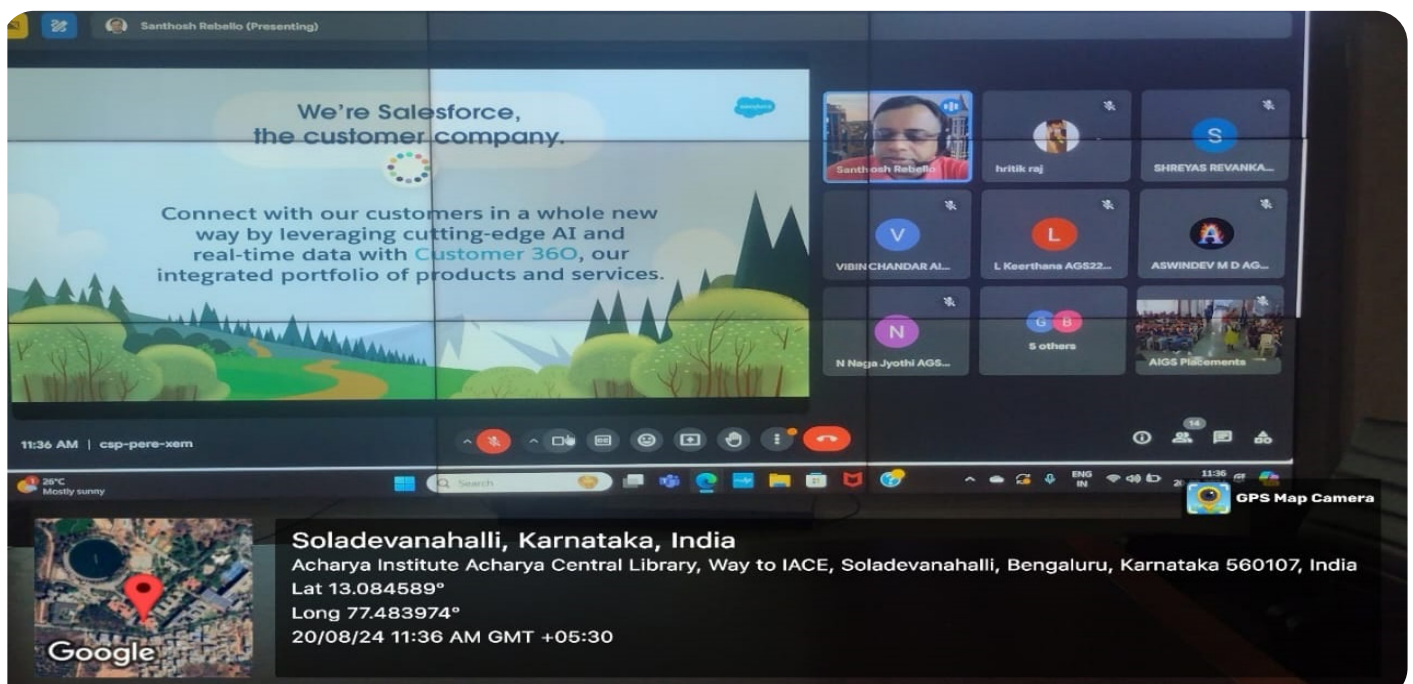

Srinivasa and located in Nayandahalli, Bengaluru, is a premier institute for the treatment and rehabilitation of psychological and psychiatric disorders. The visit was part

of the students' Abnormal Psychology coursework, requiring them to collect case histories and interact directly with patients. The clinical visit began with an introduction to the hospital's rehabilitation center, where students interacted with patients diagnosed with various psychiatric conditions, including schizophre-

Dr. Samanta emphasized the role of adaptive learning platforms and project-based learning in fostering

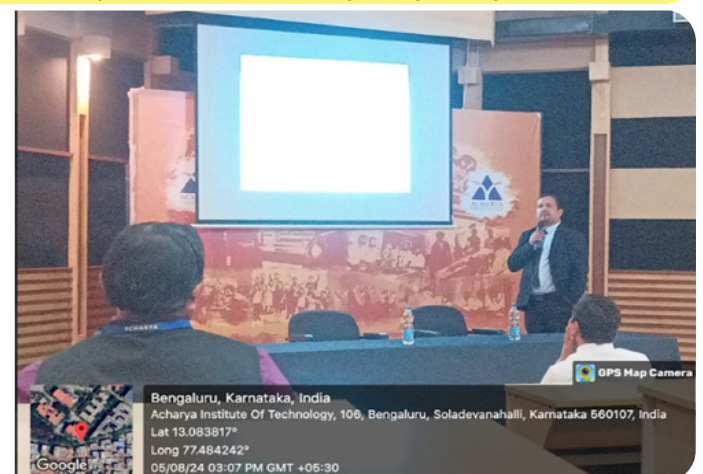
engagement and personalized learning experiences.

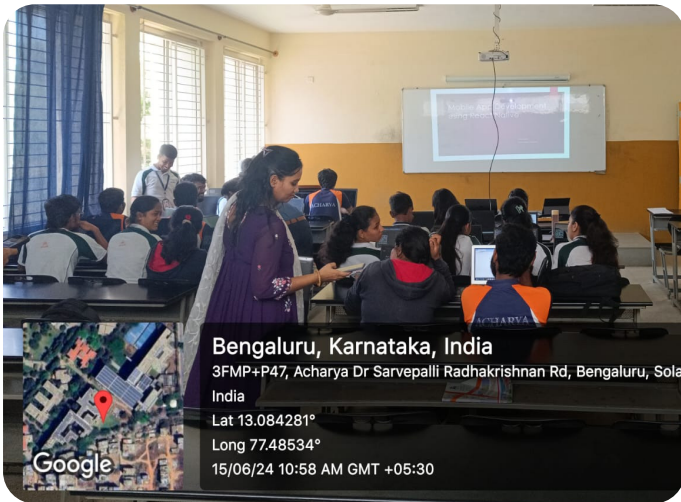

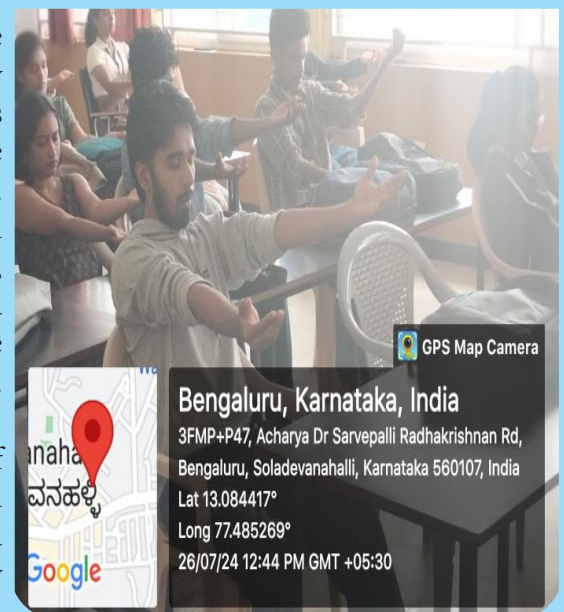
Workshop on Hypnotherapy & Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP) 26th July

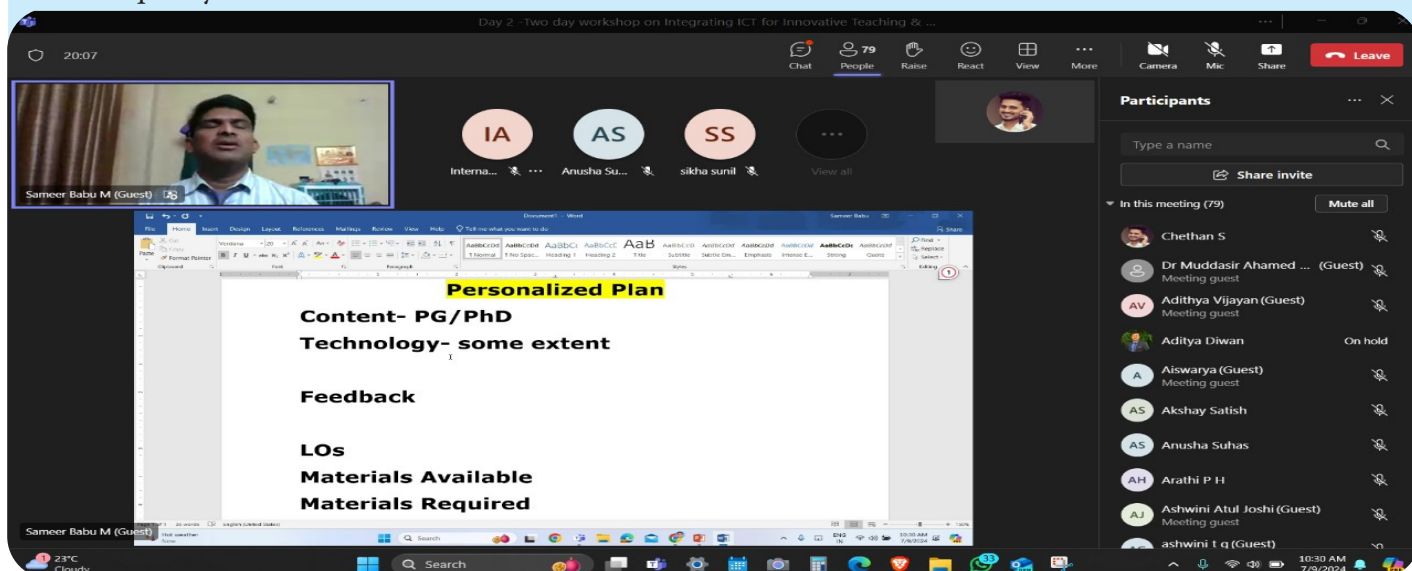
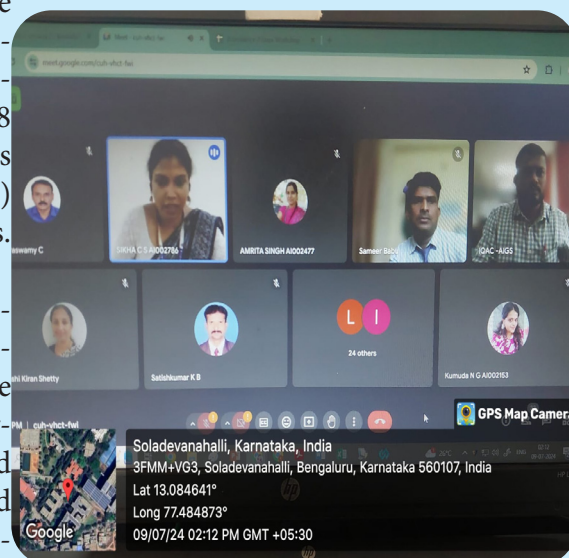
Two-Day Workshop on Integrating ICT for Innovative Teaching & Learning – 8th-9th July 2024

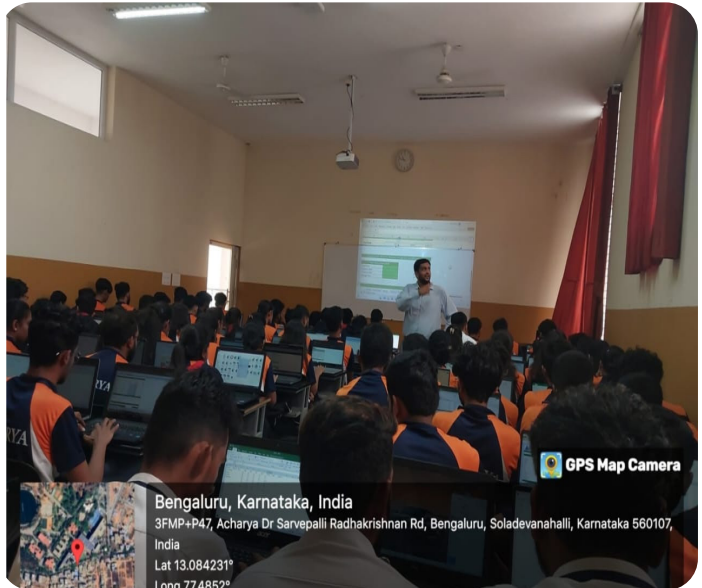


Advanced Excel Workshop 30th & 31st August 2024

The event concluded with students expressing their appreciation for the valuable insights gained during the session. Many left with a deeper understanding of the complexities surrounding LGBTQ+ issues and the importance of supporting this community. Overall, the session was well-received, and it motivated students to think critically about their responsibilities as future psychologists in advancing equality and inclusion for all.
