topics in the IT industry, honing public speaking and analytical skills.

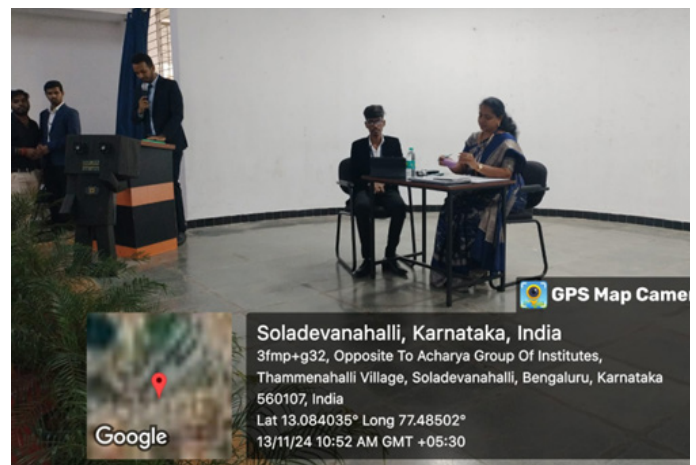

Each team was then allotted two minutes to present their strate-

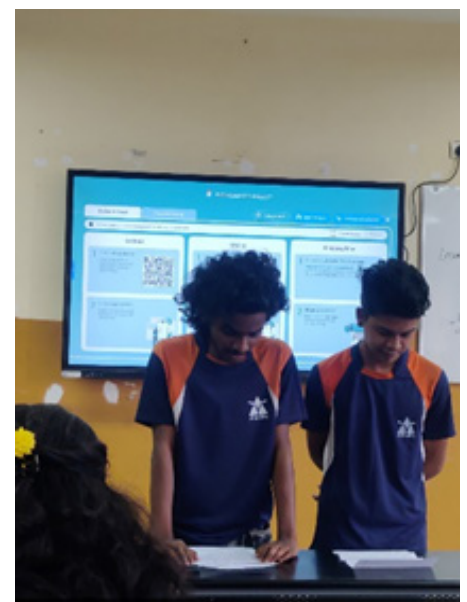

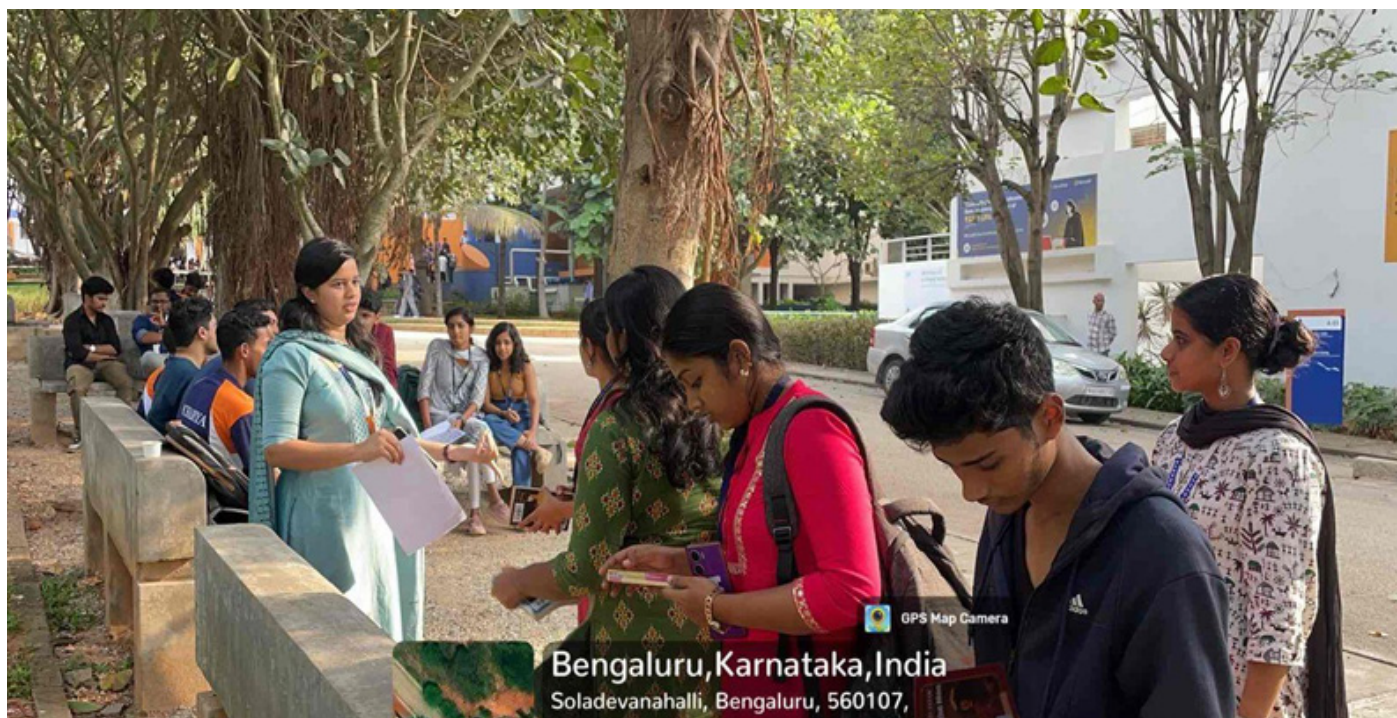
The competition provided a valuable platform for students to demonstrate critical thinking, collaboration, and decision-making

A highlight of the event

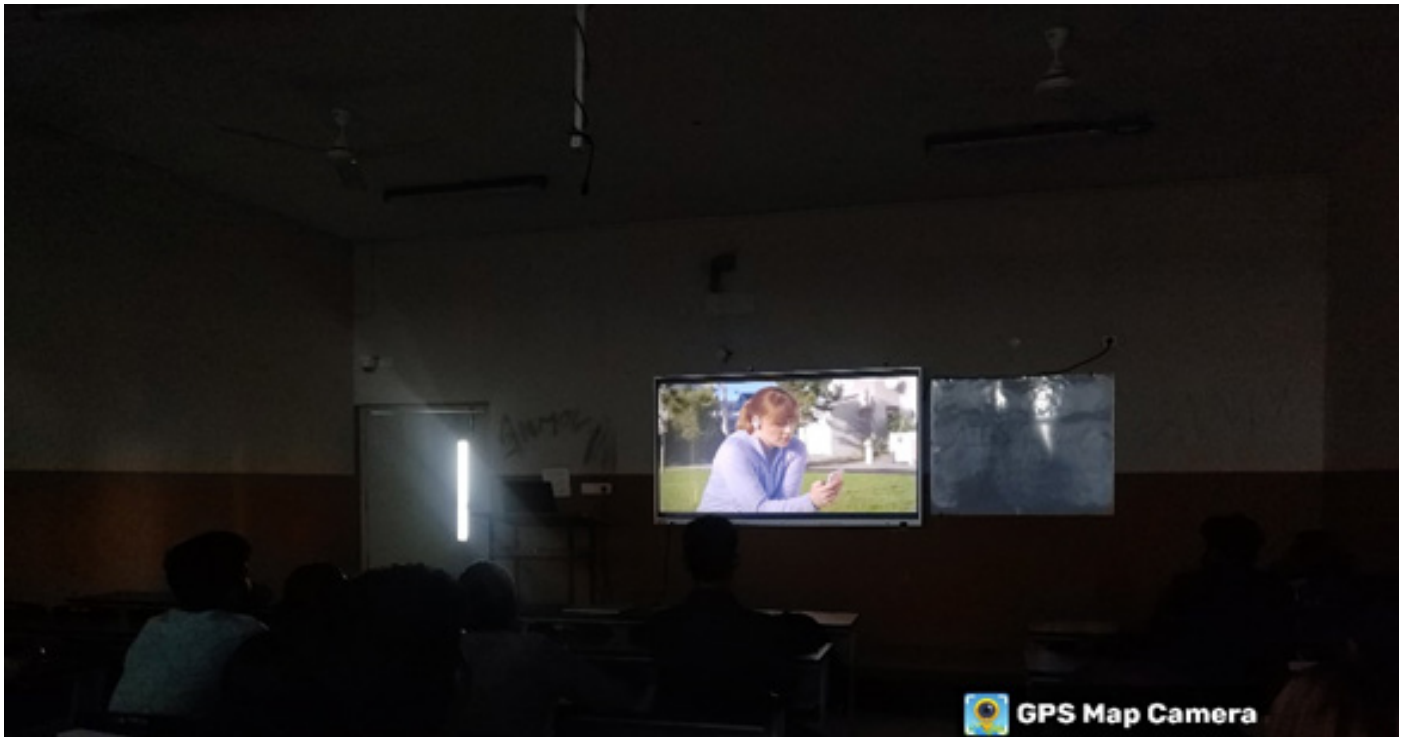

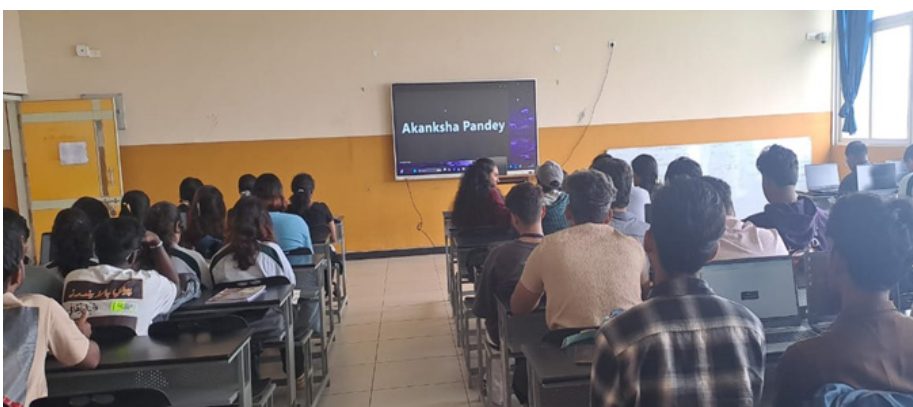

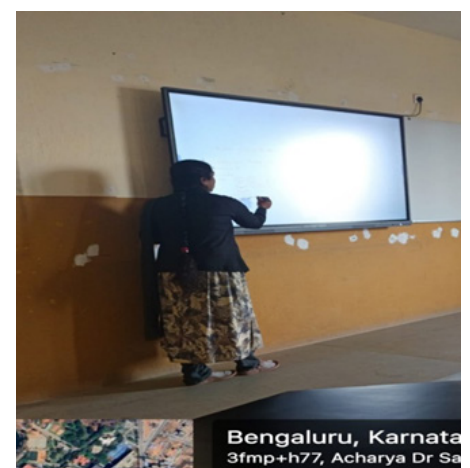

Mr. Manoj H R highlighted the array of learning and development opportunities available to students during their internships, such as workshops, mentorship

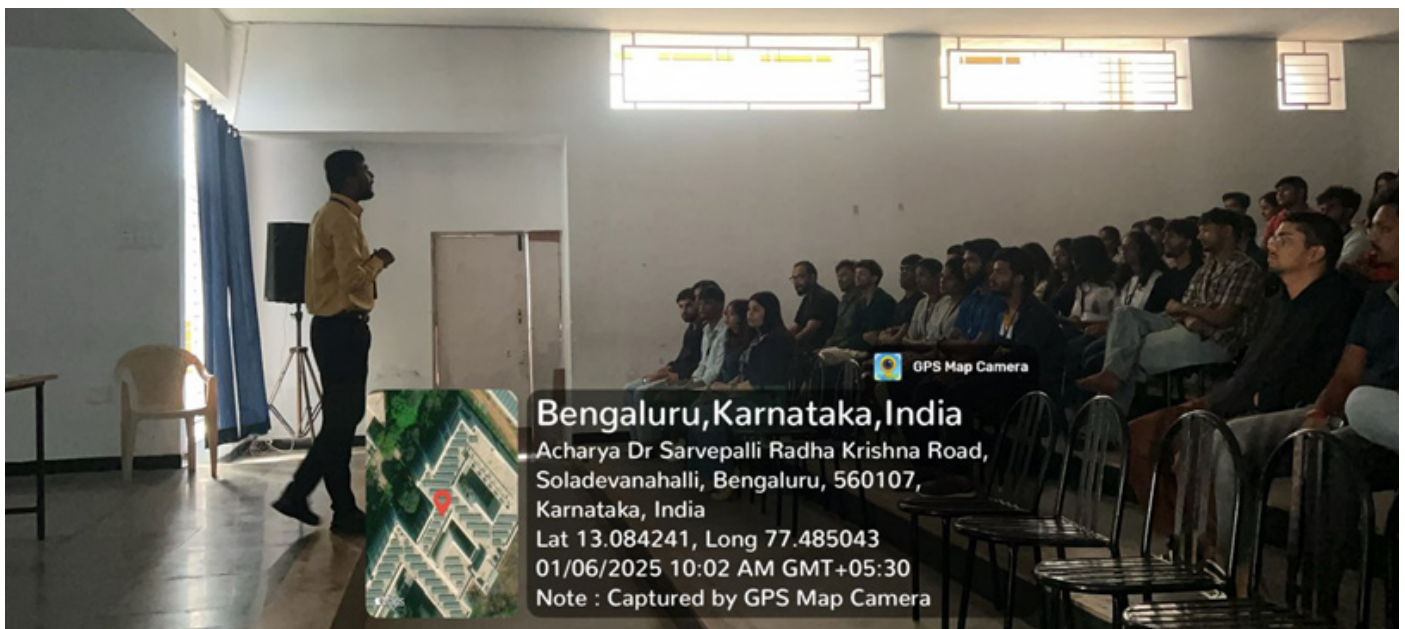

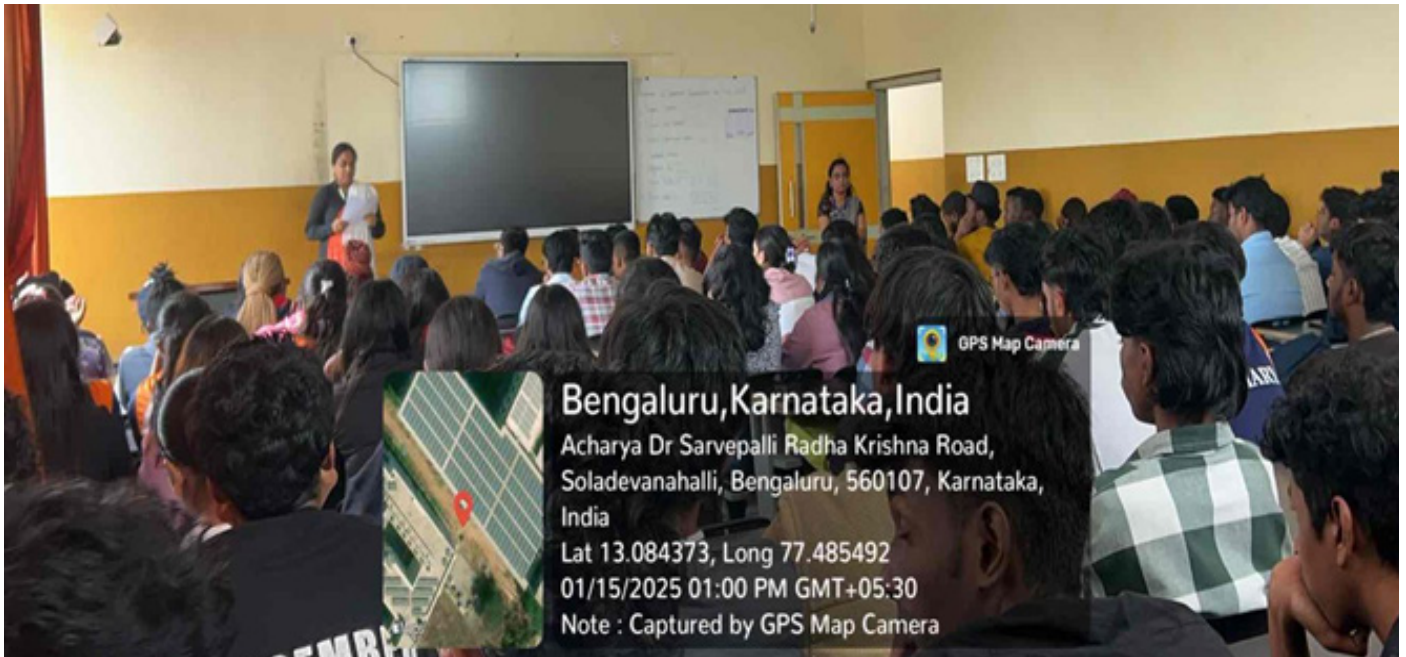
Throughout the session, participants gained insights into industry trends, the use of relevant tools and technologies, and strategies for effective communi-

LinkedIn Learning Orientation Empowers Physics Students at AIGS

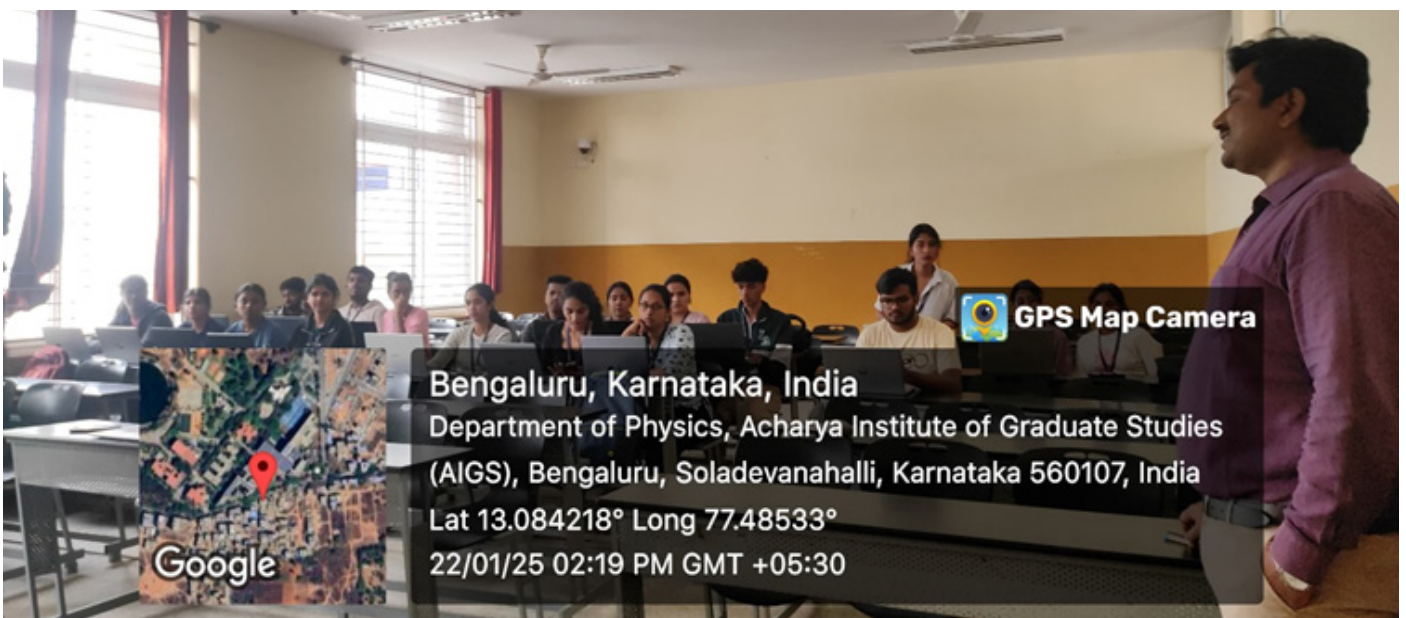

On October 22, 2024, the Department of Psychology at Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies conducted an engaging webinar on Pervasive Developmental Disorders (PDDs). The online session, attended by 68 third-semester BA Psychology students, aimed to enhance understanding of developmental conditions such as Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), Asperger's Syndrome, and Rett Syndrome. The event was led by Ms. Kavya Kollody, an experienced clinical psychologist from Mindful TMS NeuroCare.

Ms. Kollody began by providing an overview of PDDs, explaining their key characteristics, including delays in socialization, communication, and behavioral

development. She emphasized the importance of recognizing early signs, such as delayed speech, limited eye contact, and repetitive behaviors, and elaborated on diagnostic tools used for identifying these disorders. The session highlighted the need for early diagnosis to ensure effective intervention and better outcomes.

The webinar also explored various therapeutic approaches, including Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA), speech therapy, and occupational therapy. Ms. Kollody emphasized the necessity of a multidisciplinary approach involving healthcare professionals, educators, and family members to create a supportive environment for individuals with developmental

challenges. Real-life examples and case studies were shared, making the session practical and relatable for the attendees.

An interactive Q&A segment allowed participants to clarify doubts and engage in discussions about challenges in diagnosis, the effectiveness of therapeutic interventions, and the role of inclusive education. 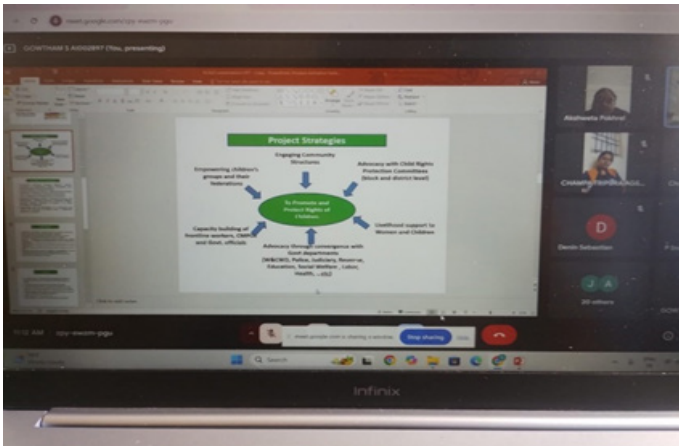
continuous learning and development. Discussions also covered knowledge exchange, workforce training, and creating pathways for industry placements.

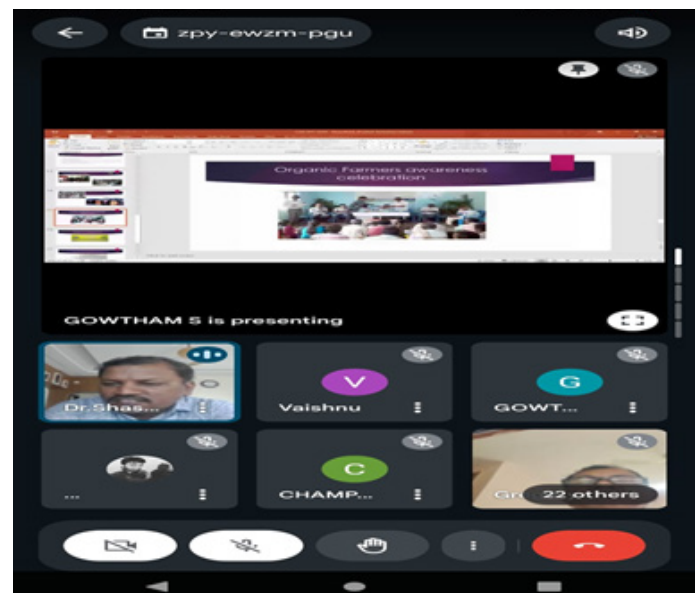
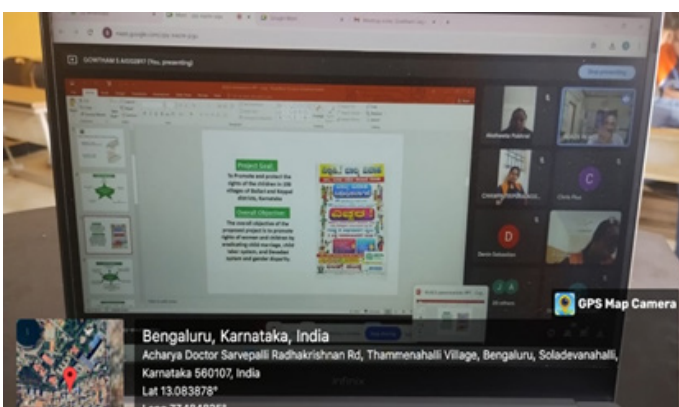

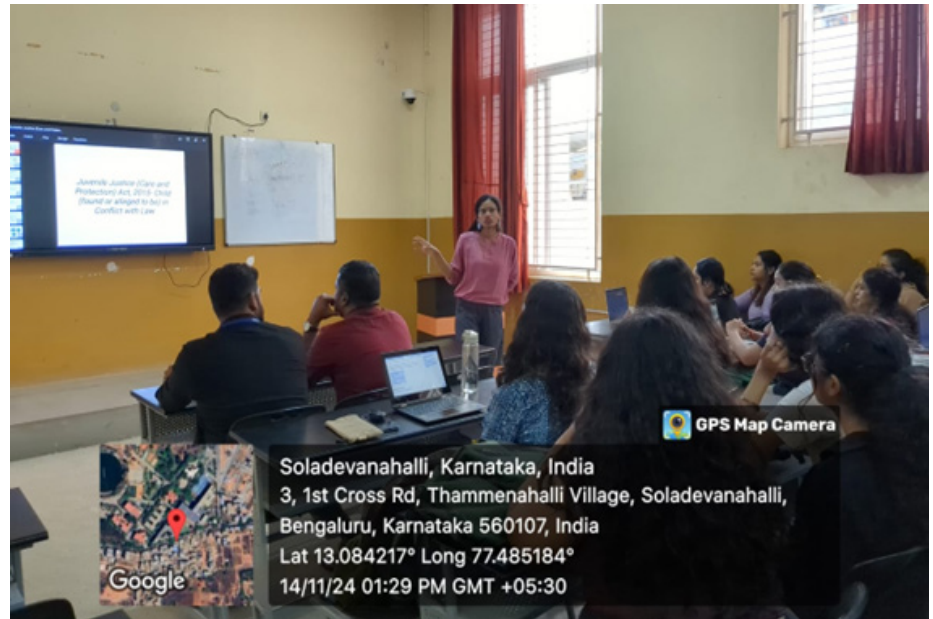


Guest Talk Explores the Juvenile Justice Act

On November 14, 2024, the Department of Criminology and Forensic Science at Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies hosted a guest talk on the “Juvenile Justice Act.” Held in Room AIGS 003, the session was attended by 50 fifth-semester students. 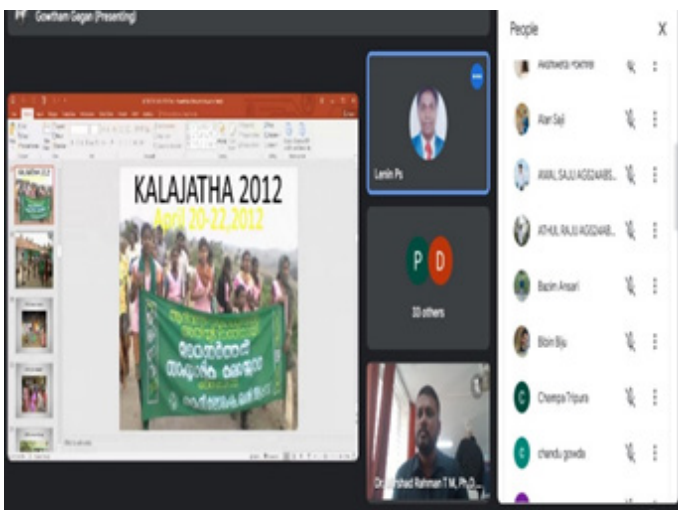

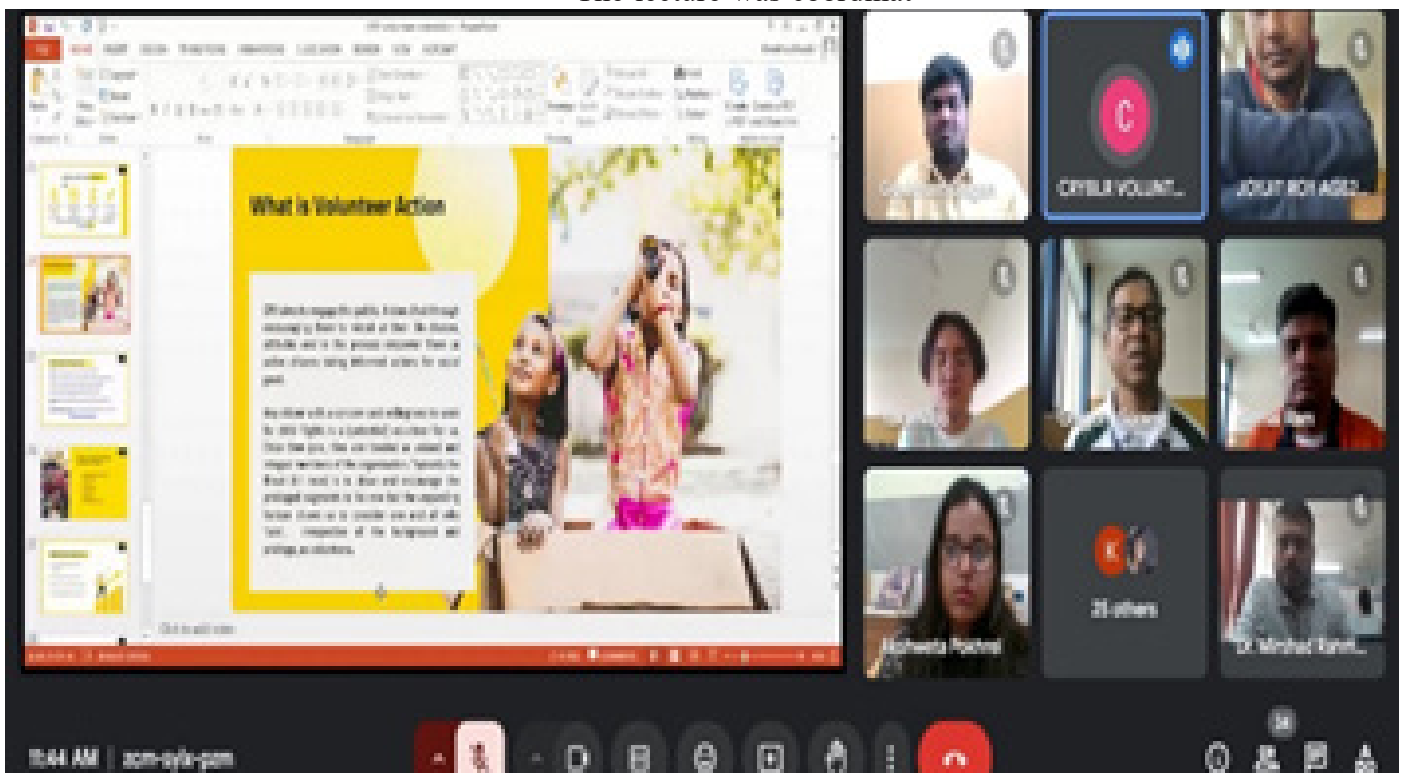

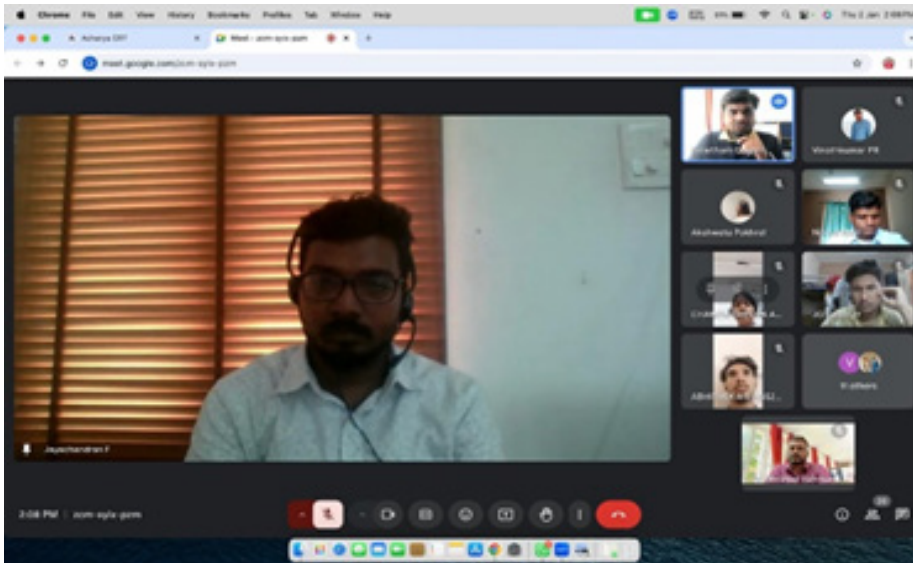

BSW Students Gain Valuable Insights at Sri Aurobindo Society Orientation

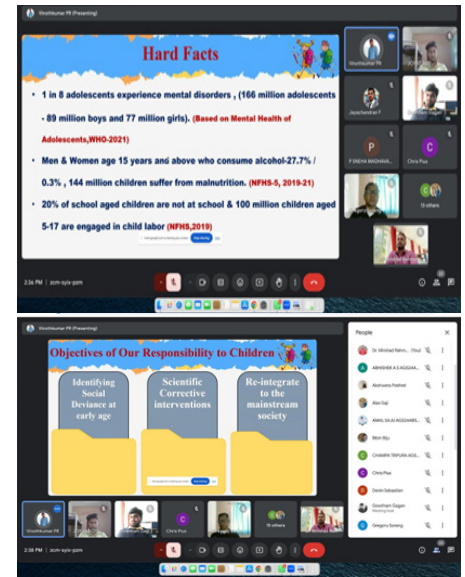

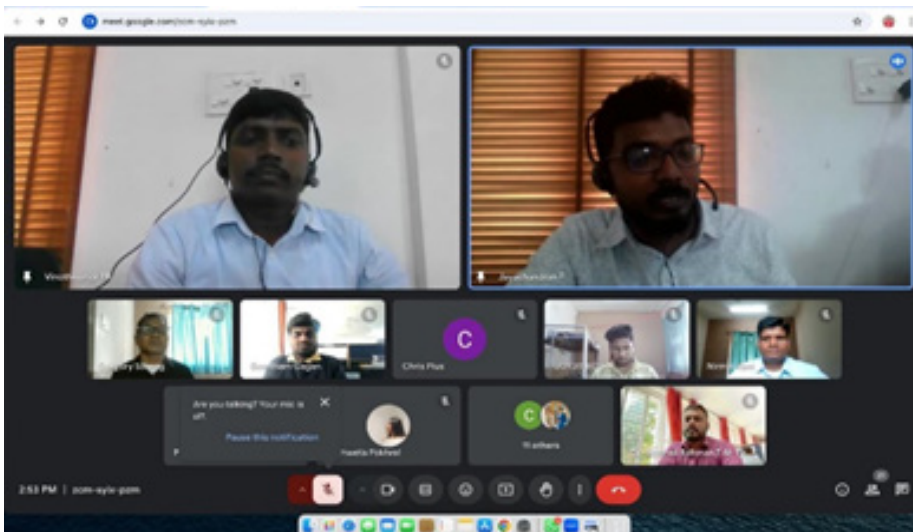
Students were given the opportunity to engage directly with the speakers during a lively inter-



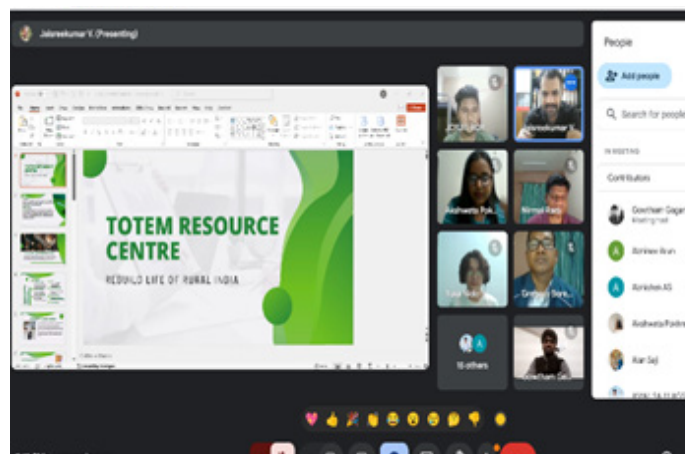
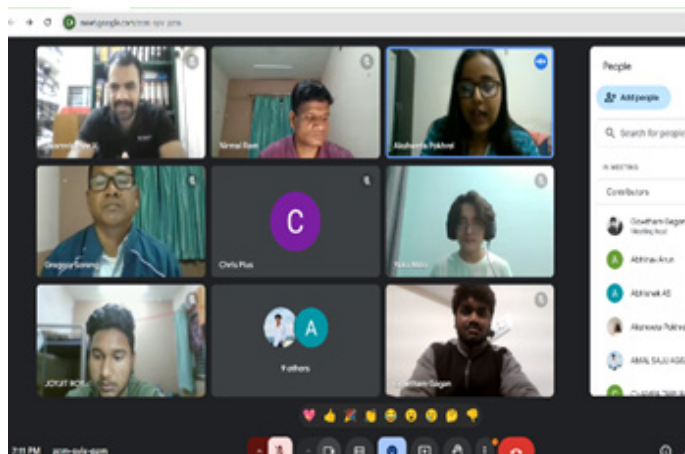

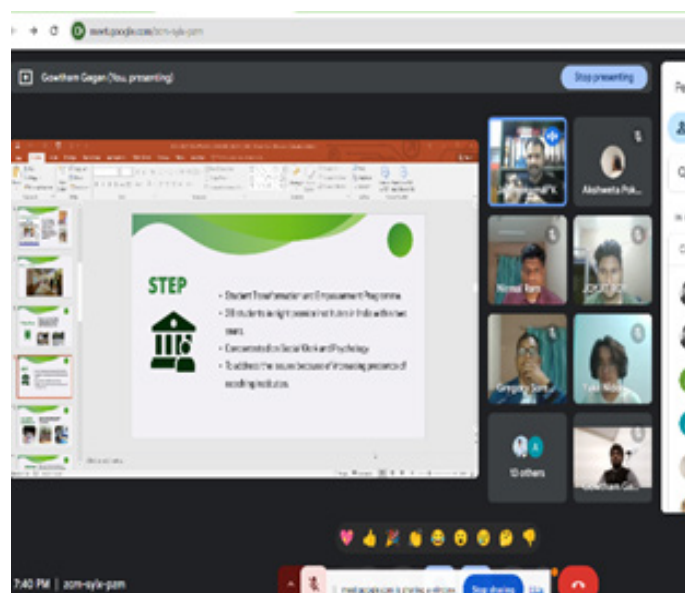
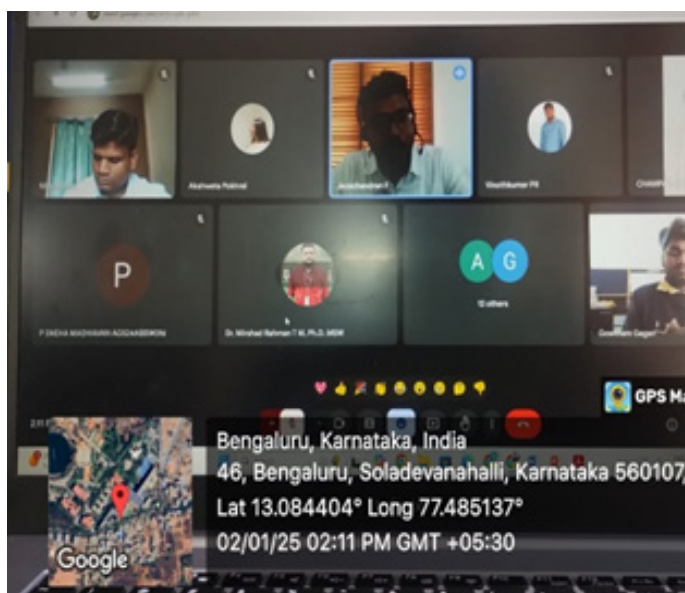
Guest Lecture Illuminates Social Work Pathways for First-Year Students

Training Program Ignites Social Work Aspirations



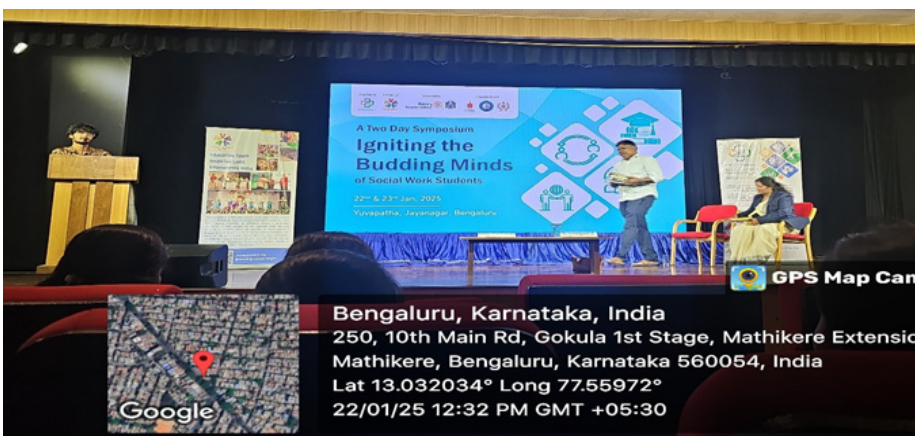

dent needs. Dr. Phil Laird followed with a discussion on the ethical challenges posed by technology in classrooms, focusing on data privacy and equitable access.

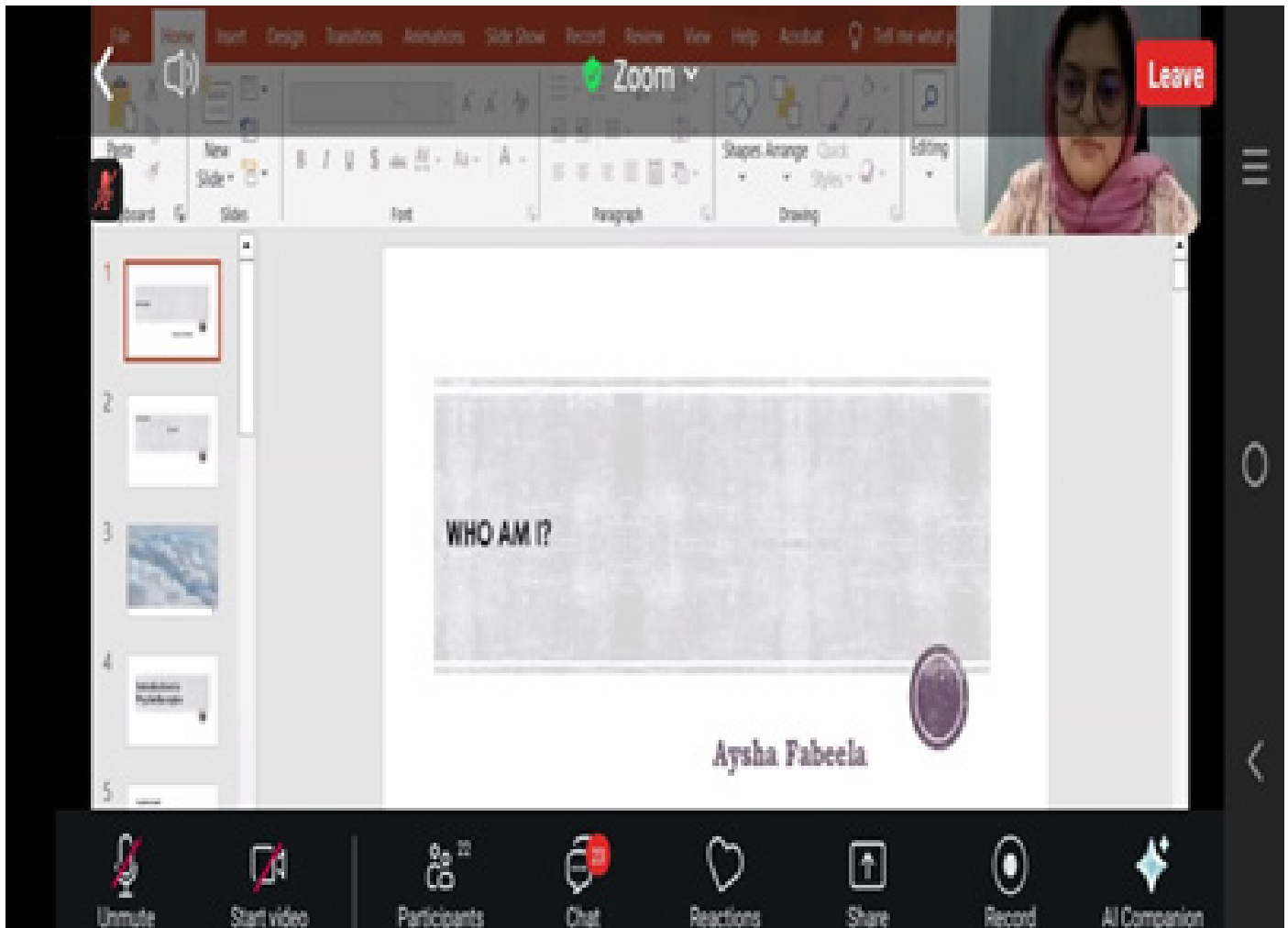

Faculty were also shown how to save, share, and revisit lessons, streamlining the review process and reinforcing student engagement.

Feedback collected after the session reflected widespread approval, with 62% of respondents expressing strong agreement about the training's effectiveness and 37% agreeing. Only 1% remained neutral. The program fostered both confidence and collaboration among participants, who are now better prepared to integrate smart board technology into their pedagogical approaches. The ceremony commenced

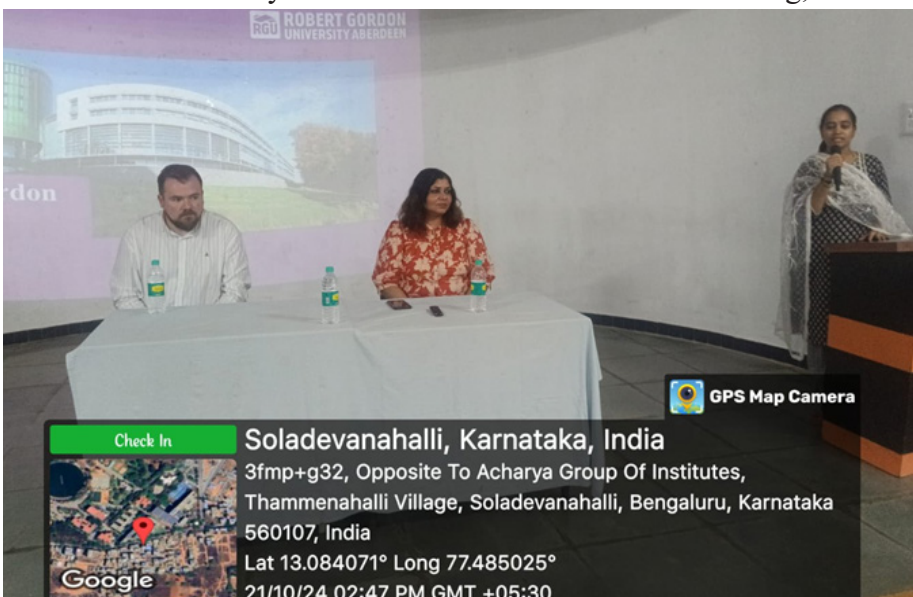

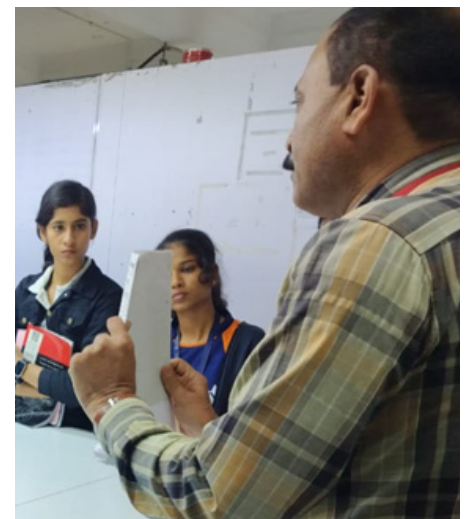

Workshop Promotes Crime Prevention Awareness Among School Students



On November 8, 2024, the Department of Criminology and Forensic Science at Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies conducted an interactive workshop on “Crime Prevention” at BRS Global School, Bengaluru. The workshop aimed to educate 225 school students across grades 1-12 about personal safety, peer influence, and the consequences of substance abuse, tailoring the content to their developmental stages.

The workshop began at 10:00 AM with an introduction to the importance of crime prevention, followed by activities and discussions designed to engage students across three age groups. Younger students in grades 1-4 participated in sessions on personal safety, including a lesson on

recognizing “good touch and bad touch.” An engaging fingerprinting activity introduced them to the uniqueness of personal identity, sparking their curiosity about forensic science.

For middle schoolers (grades 5-8), the focus shifted to peer pressure, helping them recognize its influence and develop strategies to make independent decisions. A memory game called Kim’s Game enhanced their observation skills, and short videos reinforced the discussion points.

High school students in grades 9-12 tackled more complex topics, including substance abuse and its connection to criminal behavior. A highlight of the session was a mock crime scene investigation, which introduced students

to forensic techniques and critical thinking in solving cases.

The interactive nature of the workshop encouraged open discussions, with students asking questions about personal safety and real-world challenges. Facilitators, including Ms. Anisha and Ms. Vaishnavi, provided thoughtful answers, creating a trusting environment for learning.

The program concluded at 3:00 PM with positive feedback from both students and faculty. Participants reported greater confidence in identifying unsafe situations and seeking help when needed. The workshop successfully equipped students with the knowledge and tools to contribute to a safer school environment.



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Cracking the UPSC Code: “Criminology Students Get a Head Start”



The Department of Criminology turned career counselling into an exciting mission briefing on December 3, with resource person Mr. Guru Prasad revealing how to crack the civil services exam while still in college. The one-hour workshop had 55 students leaning forward in their seats as they received what many called “the ultimate life hack.”

Mr. Prasad, showed how

criminology students already hold a secret weapon - their degree subjects overlap beautifully with UPSC’s syllabus. “You’re not just studying crimes,” he said, “you’re mastering governance, law, and social dynamics - the very fabric of civil services.”

The session became particularly lively when demonstrating time management tricks. “Think of yourself as academic ninjas,”

Prasad advised, showing how to blend college assignments with UPSC prep. Students chuckled as he compared current affairs tracking to following a thrilling crime series – “except the plot twists happen in Parliament instead of Movies.”

Interactive moments had the auditorium buzzing, especially when seniors shared their “stealth study” techniques - like turning hostel common rooms into mock interview hubs. The Q&A turned into a rapid-fire round with questions ranging from “Can my true crime podcast habit help?” (Answer: Surprisingly yes, for essay examples) to “How many chai breaks are optimal?” (Pro tip: Caffeine strategically).

As students left, many were already forming study squads, their notebooks filled not just with notes but with what one first-year called “a whole new game plan.” The department might need to stock up on extra black coffee - these future civil servants are just getting started.



AIGS Hosts Immersive Workshop on Criminal Profiling and Face Reading



The Department of Criminology and Forensic Science at Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies (AIGS) organized a one-day workshop on Criminal Profiling and Face Reading on December 10, 2024. Held in the AIGS Seminar Hall, the event drew an enthusiastic response with 119 undergraduate criminology students participating in a full-day session led by renowned behavioral analyst Mr. Zane Cuxton.

Designed to bridge academic theory and practical investigation, the workshop aimed to provide

The session highlighted the complementary nature of face reading to conventional profiling methods while also addressing the ethical and scientific limitations of physiognomic techniques.

A dedicated Q&A segment allowed students to clarify doubts and engage in deeper dialogue with the resource person. The workshop concluded with a valedictory session and a vote of thanks, followed by the presentation of a memento to Mr. Cuxton by Dr. Theju Kumar.

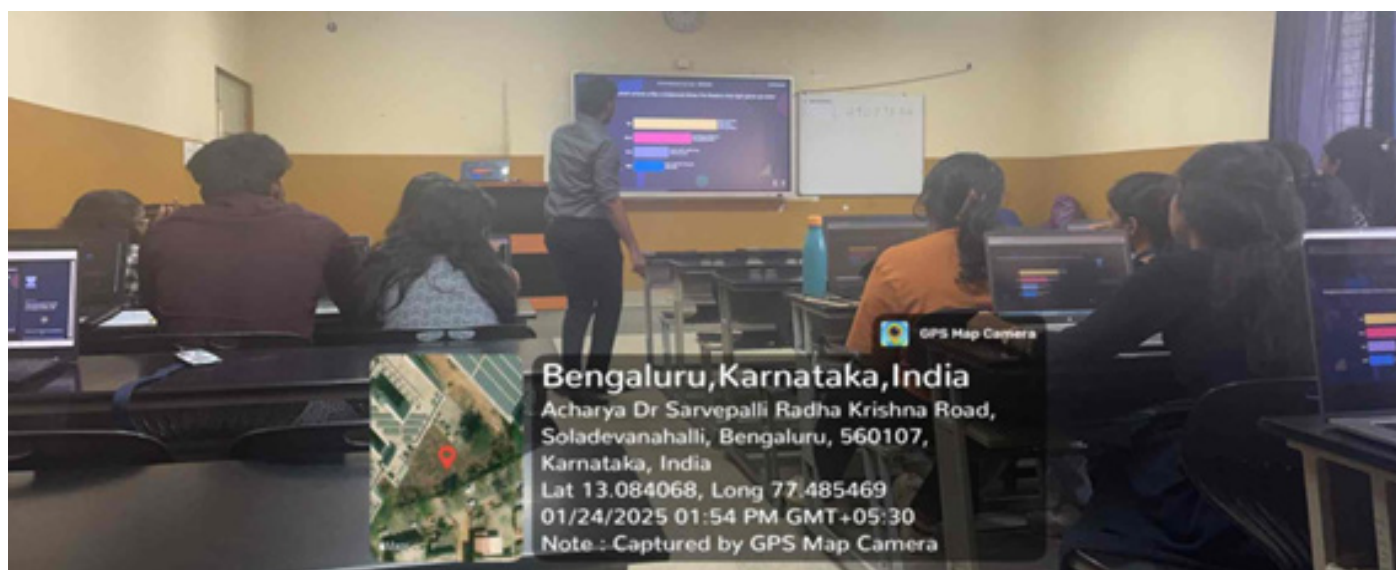

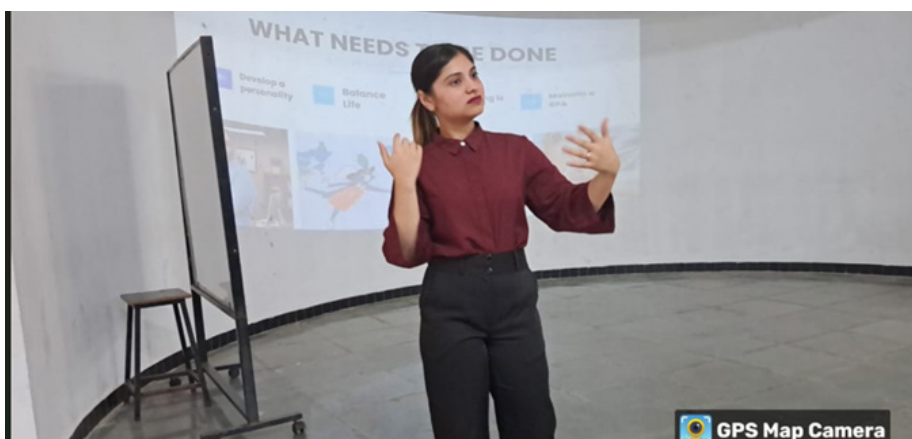

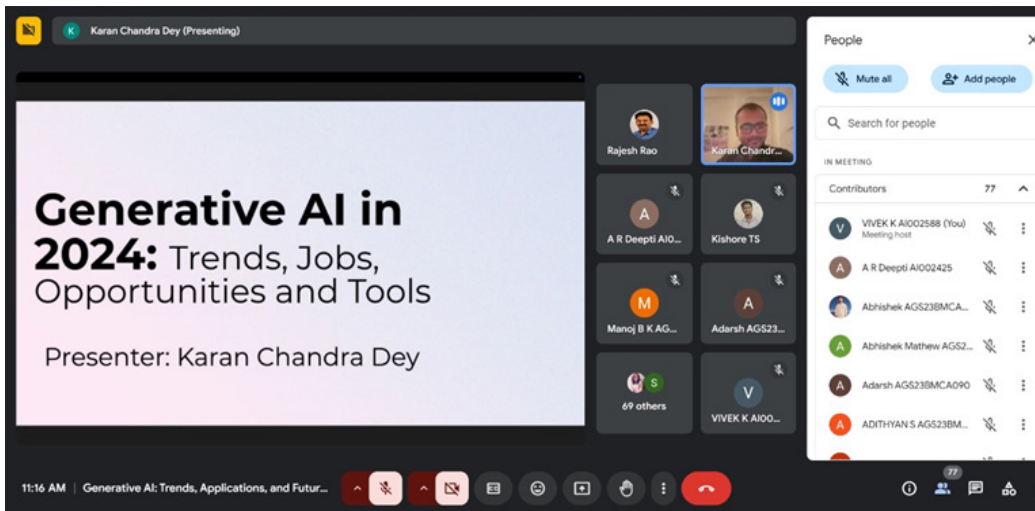
