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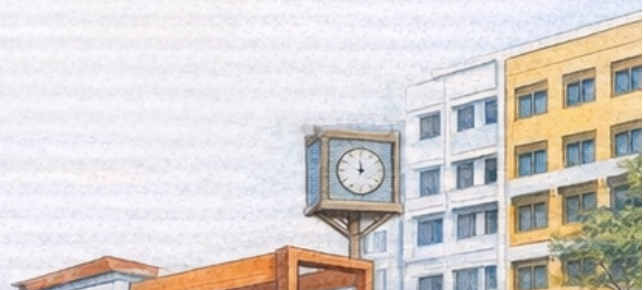
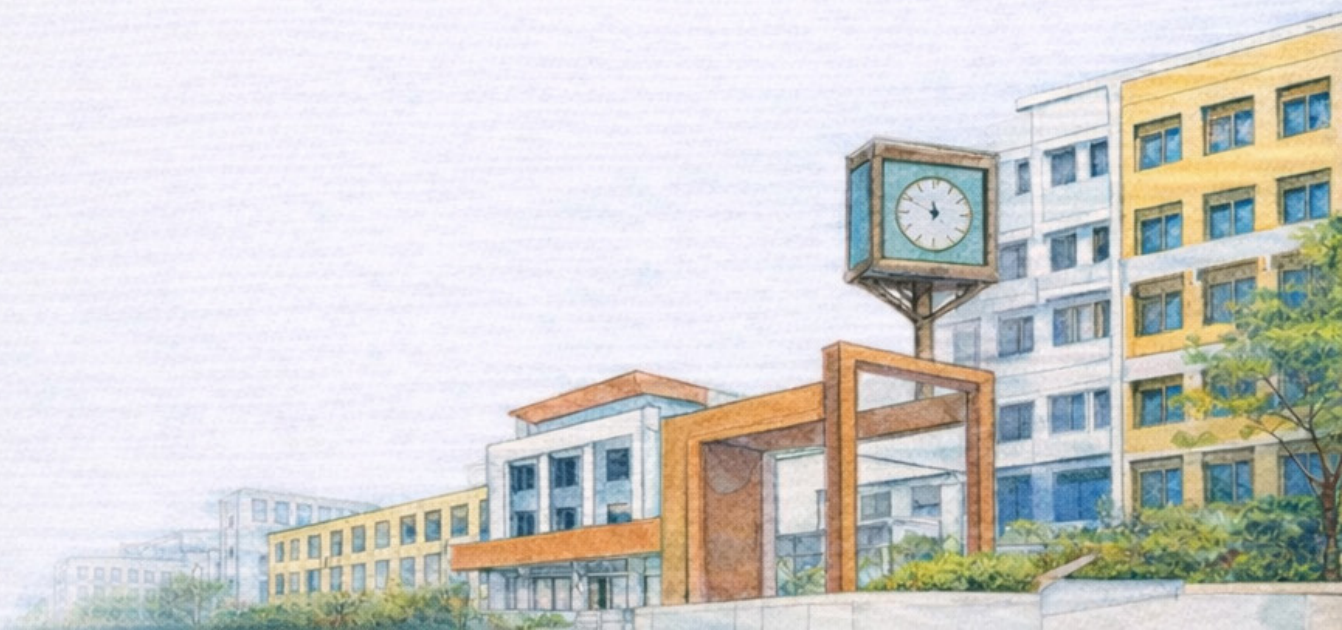


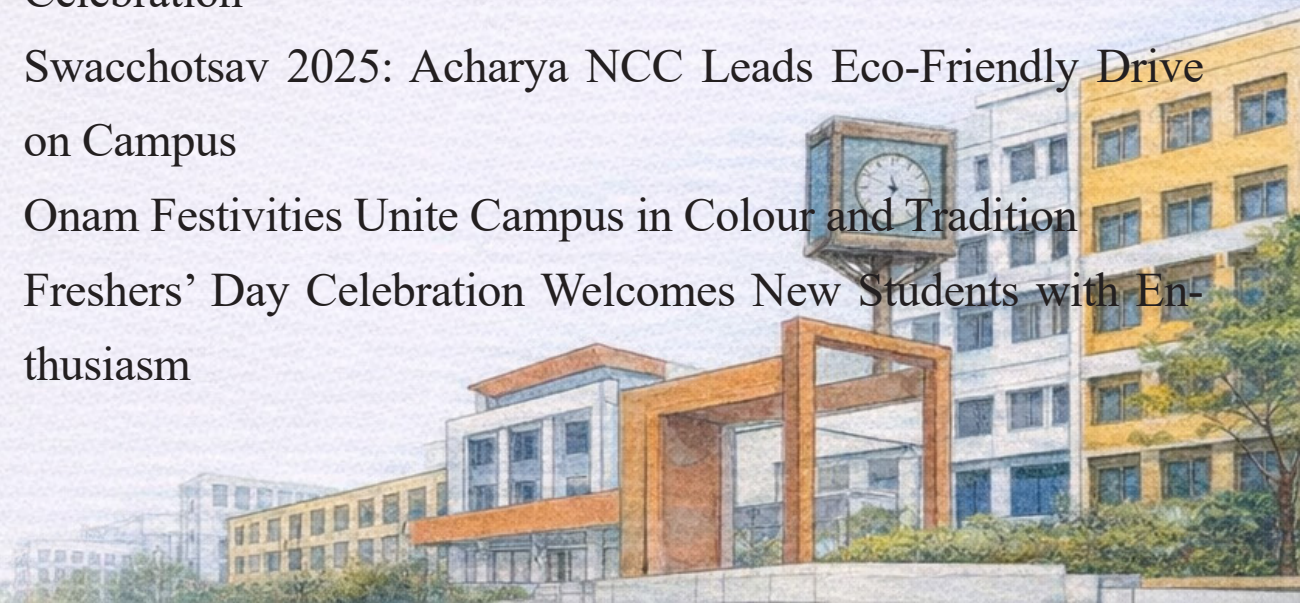

Acharya Institute Hosts Intensive UGC NET Training for MA English Students

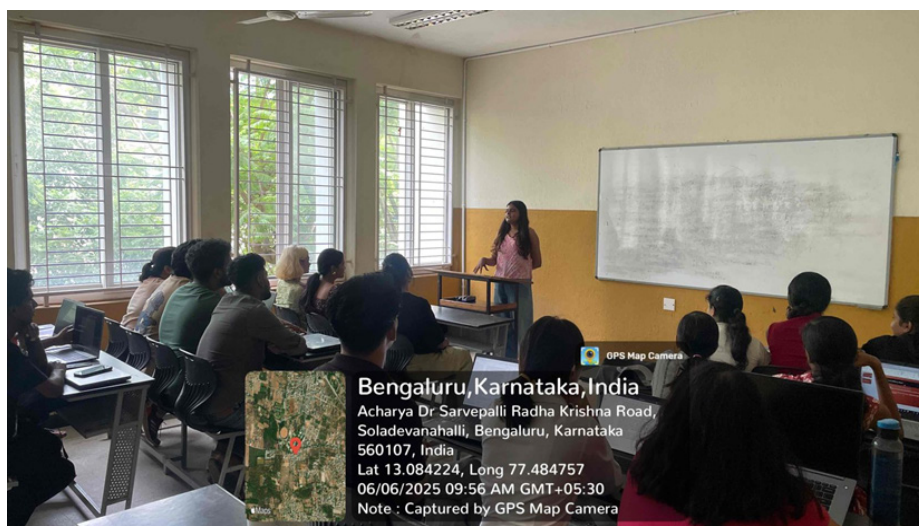


The Department of English (Postgraduate), Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies, recently concluded an intensive UGC NET Training Program aimed at enhancing exam preparedness among MA English students. Held from July 5 to July 24, 2025, at the institute's Lecture Hall in Block II, the initiative spanned fifteen sessions, each

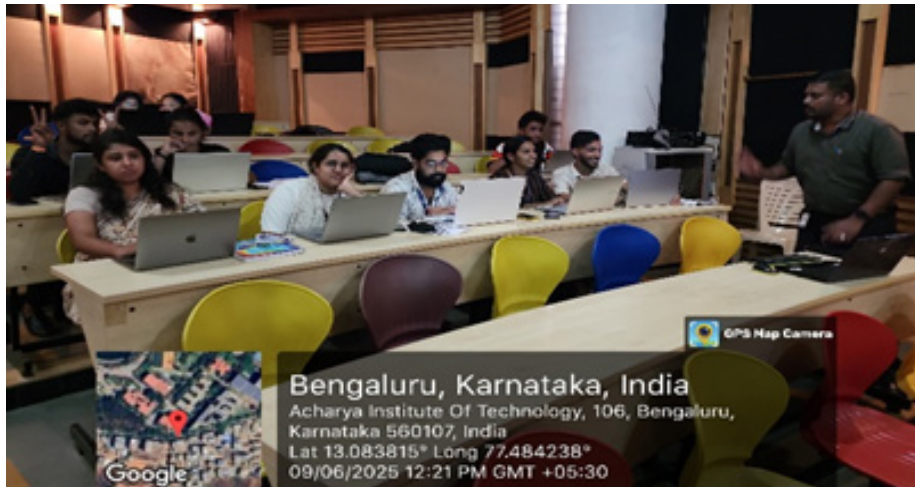
designed to foster conceptual clarity and analytical skills essential for the UGC National Eligibility Test. Guided by Dr. Usha Sai Kiran Raghupathula and supported by Head of Department Mr. Shashidhar S., the program combined expert-led lectures, analytical discussions, and targeted mock tests. Participants engaged in comprehensive

reviews of literary periods, criticism, and research methodologies, benefitting from a blended instructional model that integrated digital tools with interactive classroom teaching.

The program commenced on June 9, with Dr. Akhila K. P., Associate Professor, inaugurating the sessions by outlining the essen-

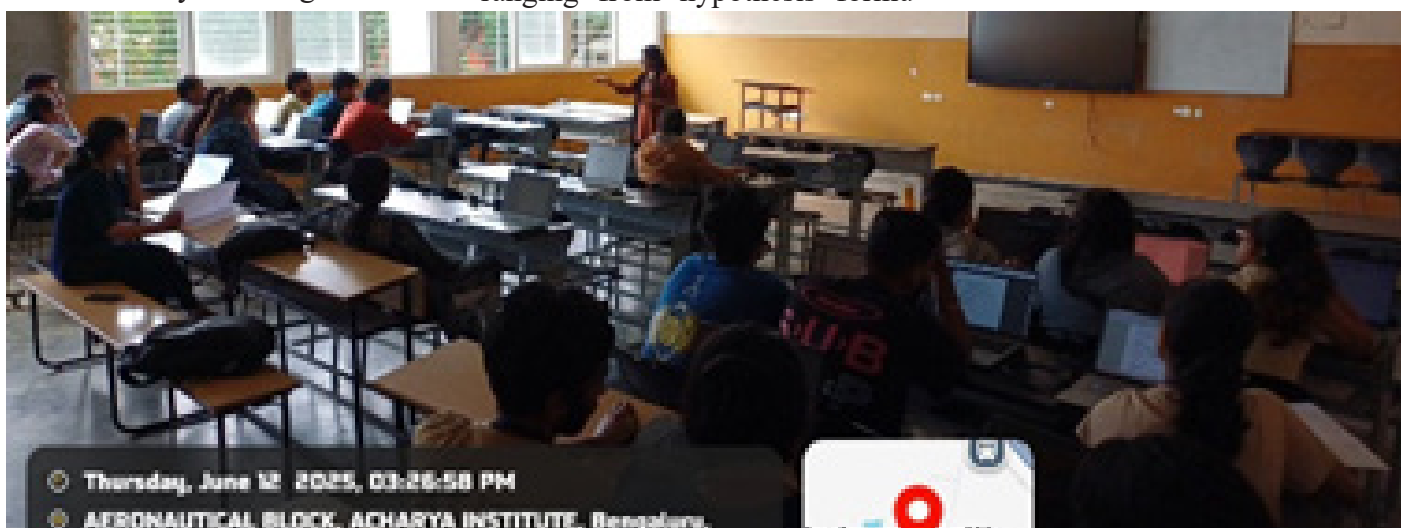

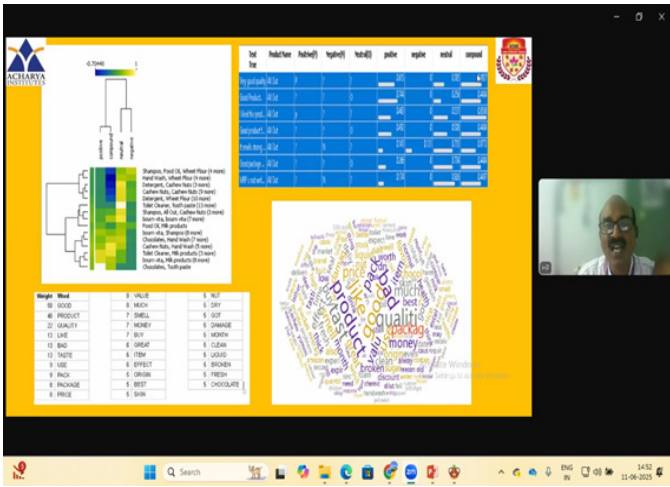

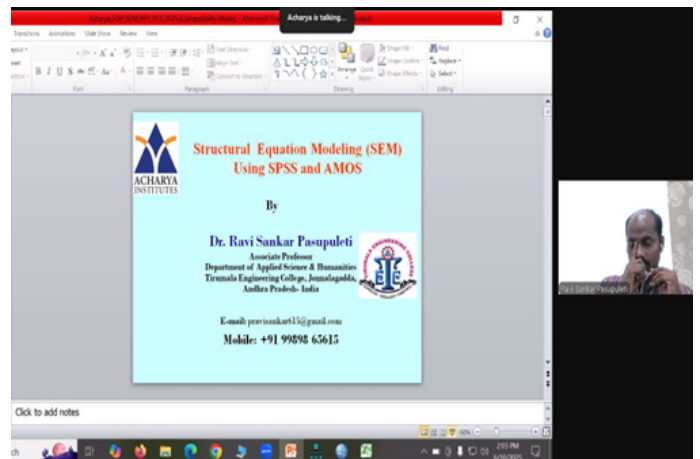

The fifth session, led by Dr. Pranav Umesh, focused on publication strategies and opportunities in management and multidisciplinary research, offering guidance on journal selection, manuscript structuring, and building academic profiles. The event culminated with a hands-on workshop conducted by Dr. Shiva Kumar, where participants practiced drafting research papers, refining their writing with AI-assisted tools, and mastering citation techniques.

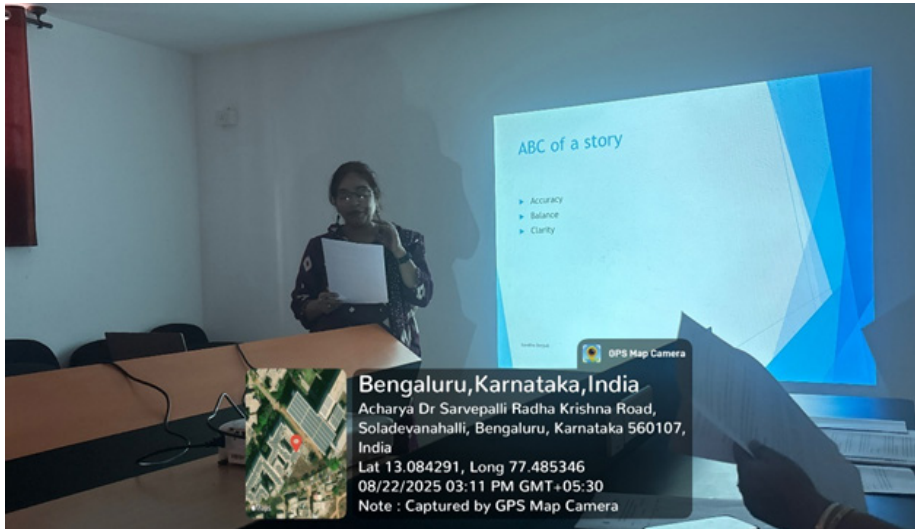
Physics Department Hosts Insightful GATE and JAM Awareness Program

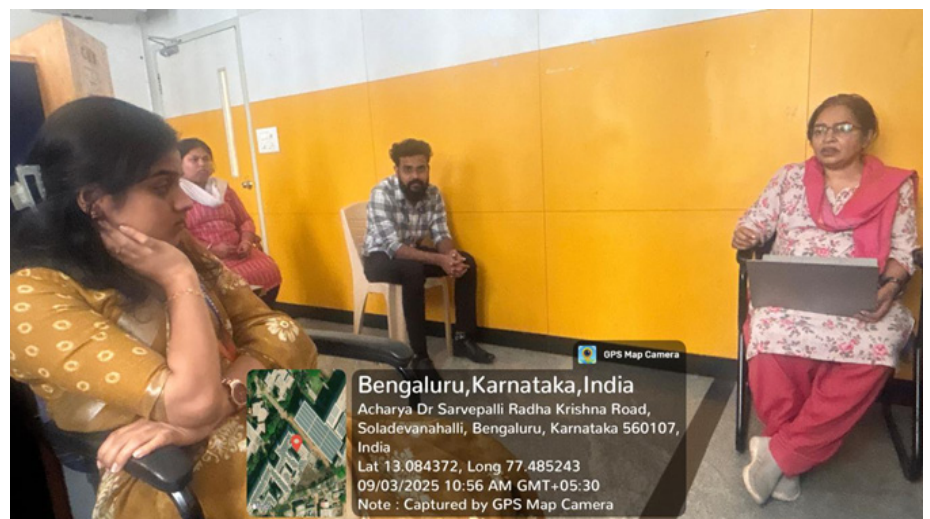
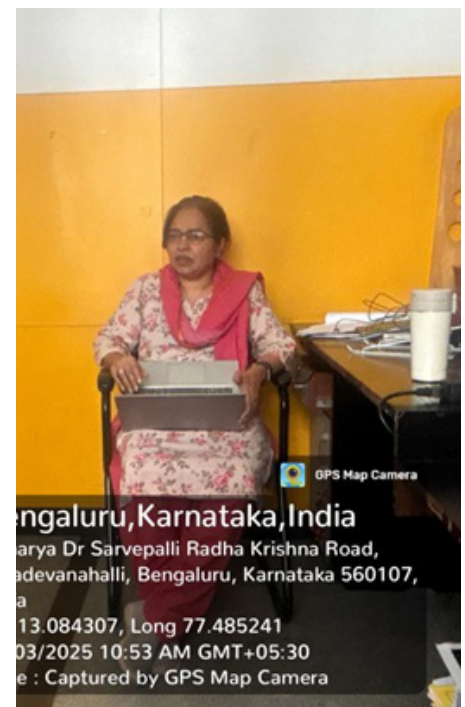
The second session, held on August 22, adopted a workshop

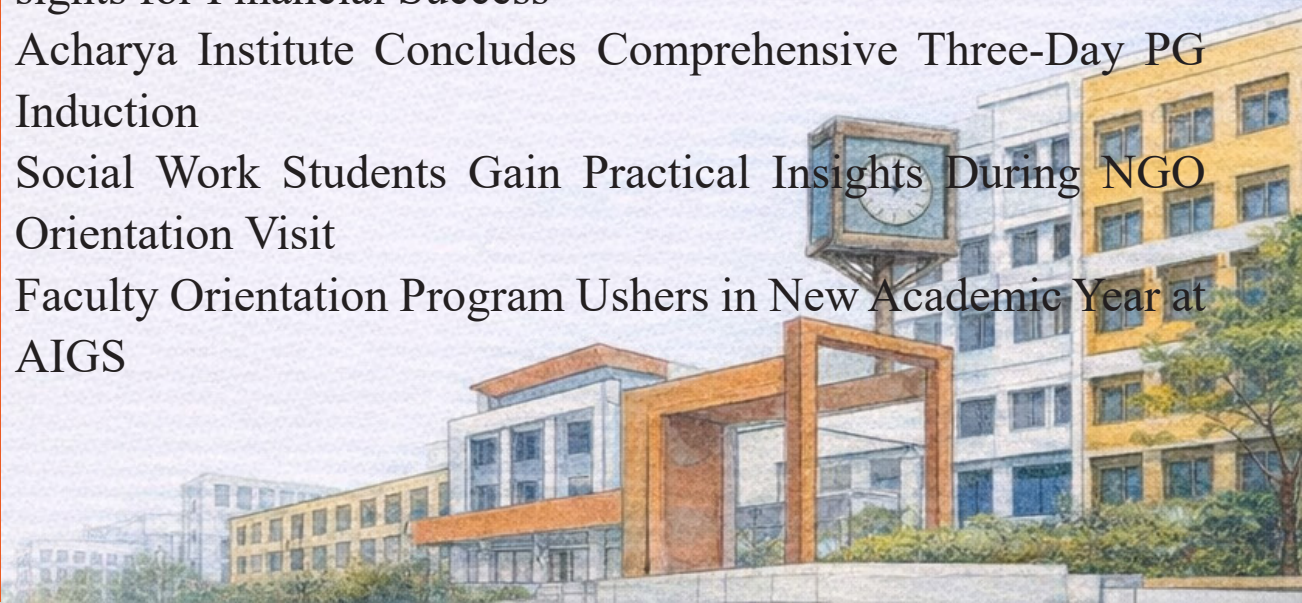
The FDP concluded with

B.Com Department Hosts Orientation for First Semester Students



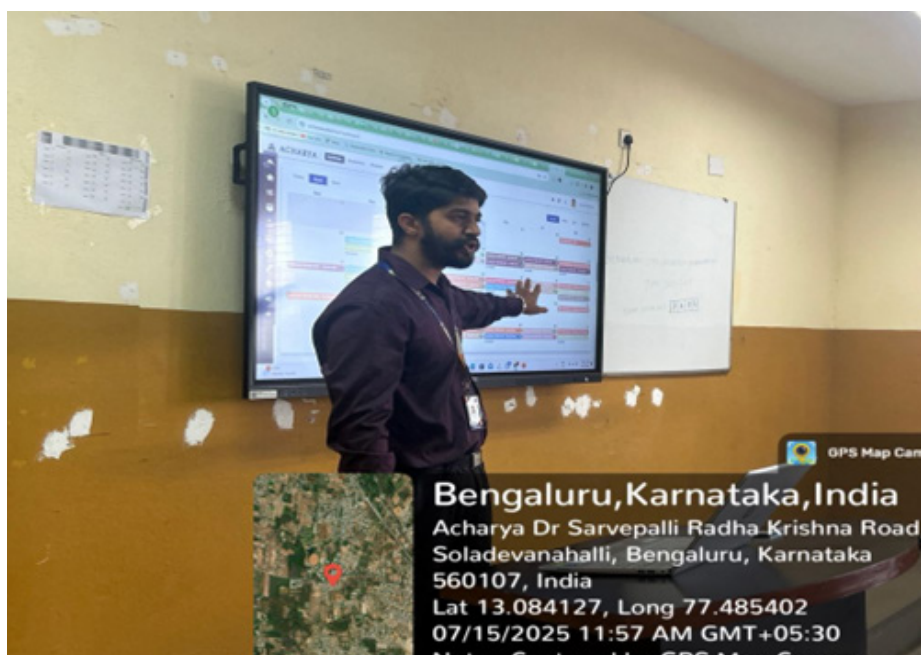

BBA Department Hosts Orientation for Incoming Students

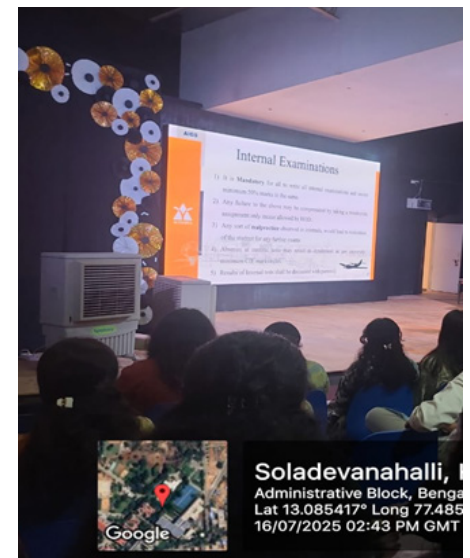

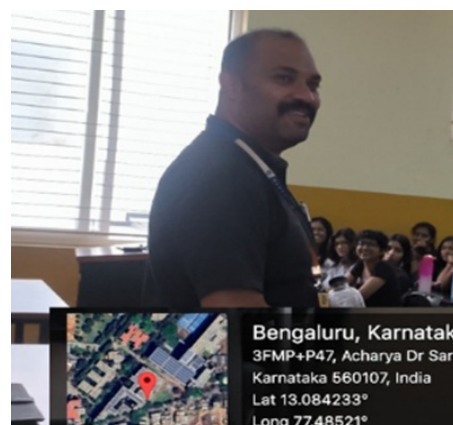

NSS Orientation Inspires Freshers at AIGS



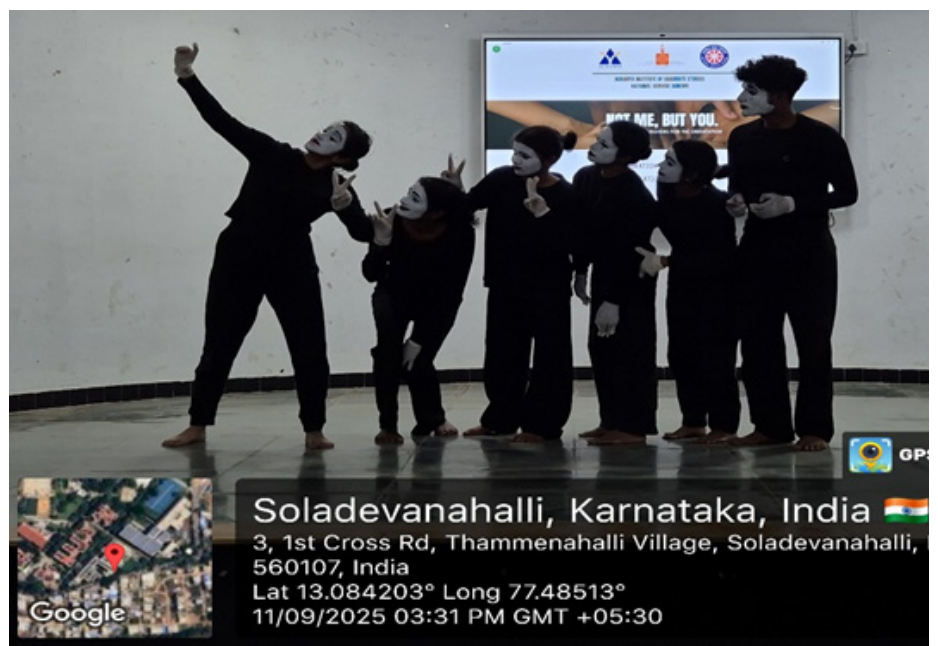

profound impact of NSS on student life.

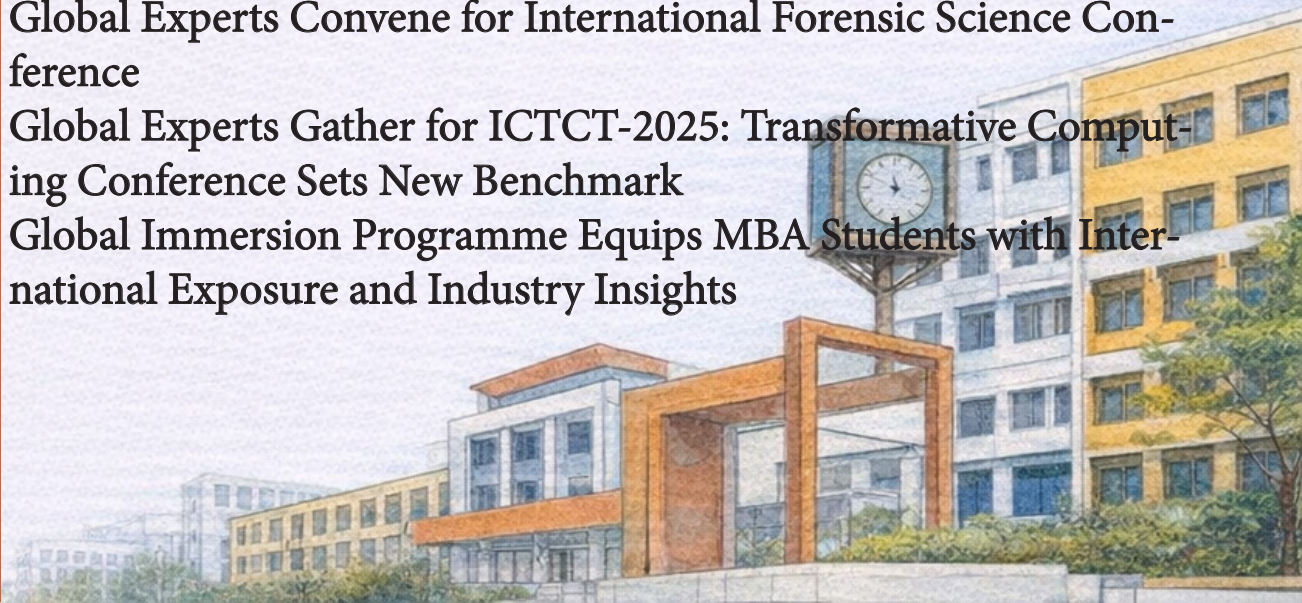
The program featured cultural performances, including group songs, mime acts, and awareness skits addressing themes such as college life and responsible media usage. A short film showcasing memorable NSS mo-

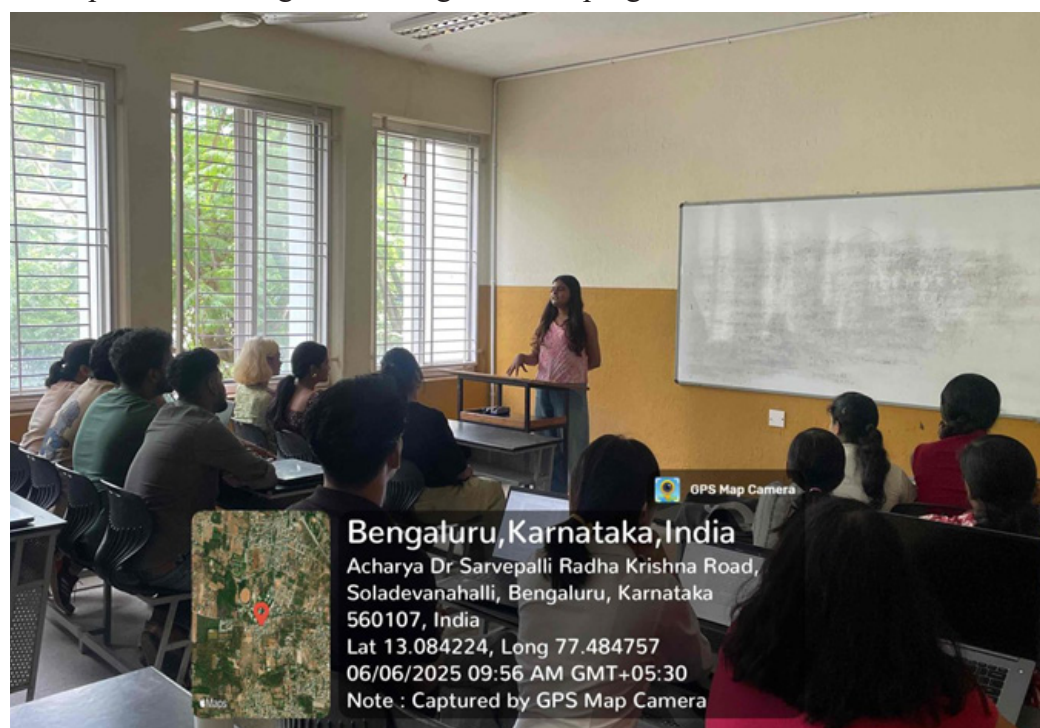

A pioneering training program addressing the mental health needs of vulnerable populations was hosted at Sense International India, Parag Residency, Bangalore, on Monday. The event, organized by the Department of Social Work at Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies (AIGS) in collaboration with Sense International India (SII), brought together 14 postgraduate students specializing in medical and psychiatric social work. The full-day session aimed to equip future mental health professionals with vital knowledge and skills for supporting individuals with deafblindness a dual sensory impairment that poses unique challenges in communication, mobility, and emotional well-being.

The program commenced with registration and distribution of training kits, setting an engaging tone for the day. She delivered a comprehensive overview of the spectrum of deafblindness, emphasizing its types, causes, and profound psychological impact. Her interactive approach, enriched with case studies and real-life examples, offered participants a glimpse into the lived experiences of individuals navigating the complexities of dual sensory loss. The morning included a pre-test to assess participants' baseline understanding, while the afternoon session delved deeper into critical issues such as social isolation, anxiety, and depression.

A highlight of the day was a five-minute experiential activity facilitated by Mr. Jobin from SII, allowing students to simulate the effects of deafblindness. This hands-on exercise provided valuable insights into the sensory and emotional challenges faced by affected individuals. Ms. Nagma from SII supplemented the training with a presentation on the organization's outreach initiatives and advocacy efforts, underscoring the significance of inclusive care and community support.

The program concluded with a Q&A session, feedback collection, and certificate distribution. Participants gained practical skills and a deeper understanding of deafblindness, aligning with the overarching mission to foster empathy and holistic support among emerging social work professionals.

Navigating the Future of Finance: Guest Talk Illuminates Emerging Career Paths

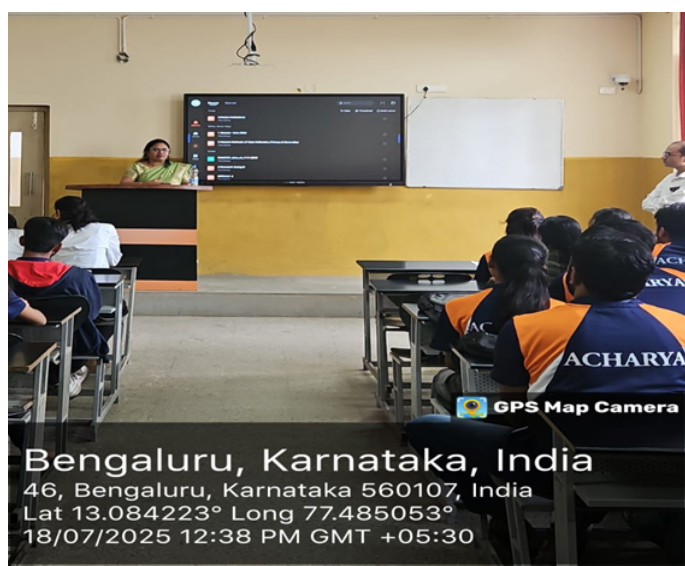

Hands-on Airport Operations Training Empowers Aviation Students

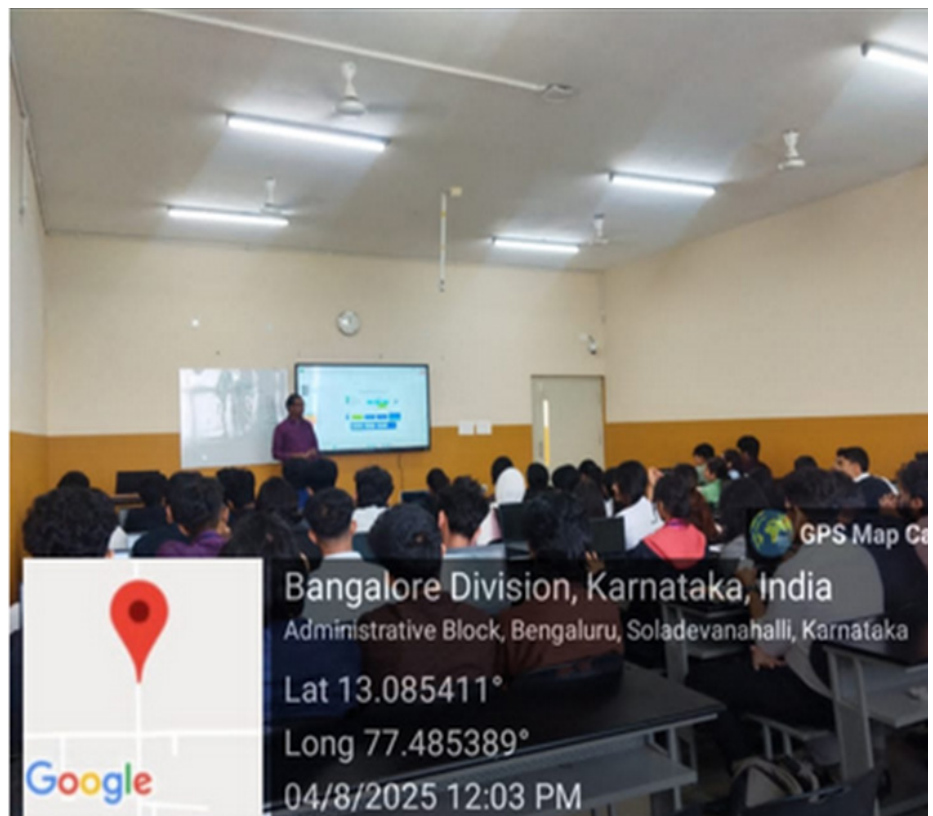

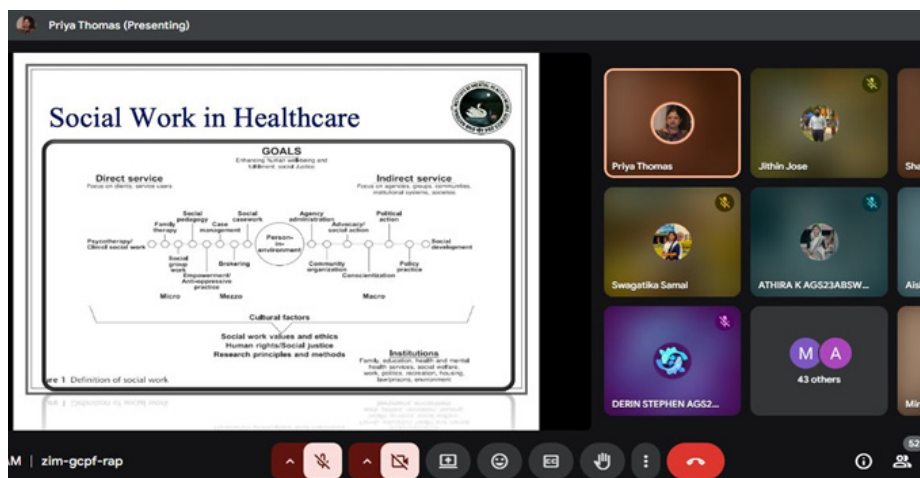
management.

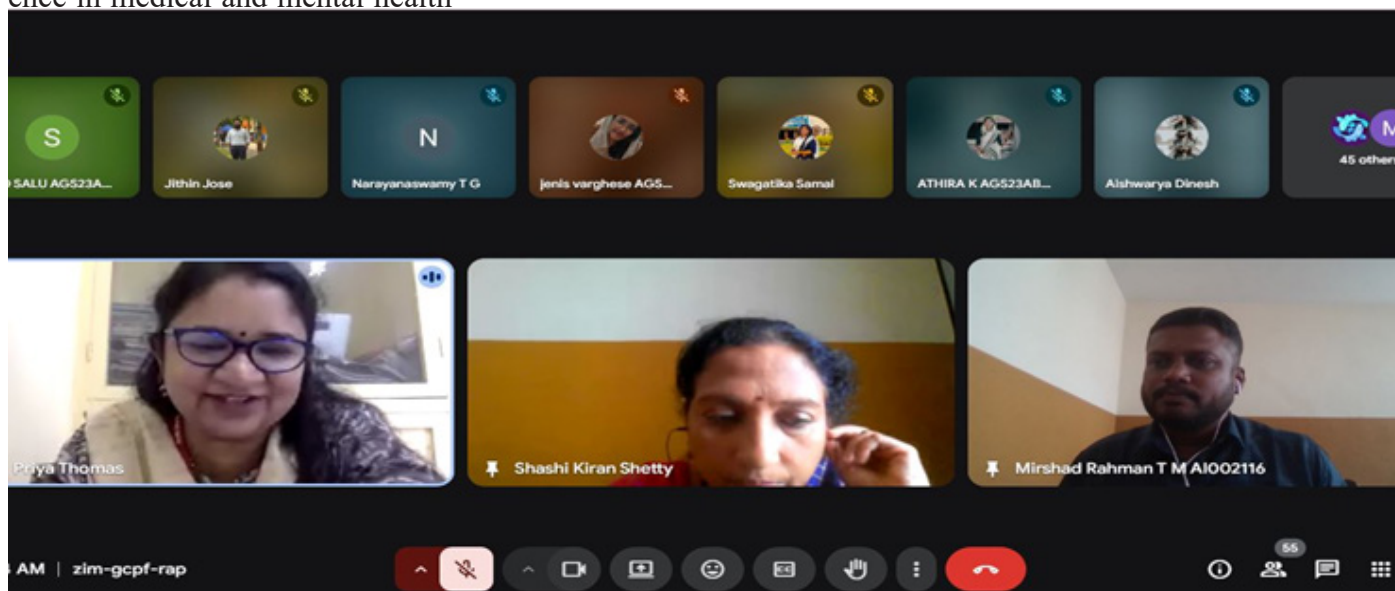

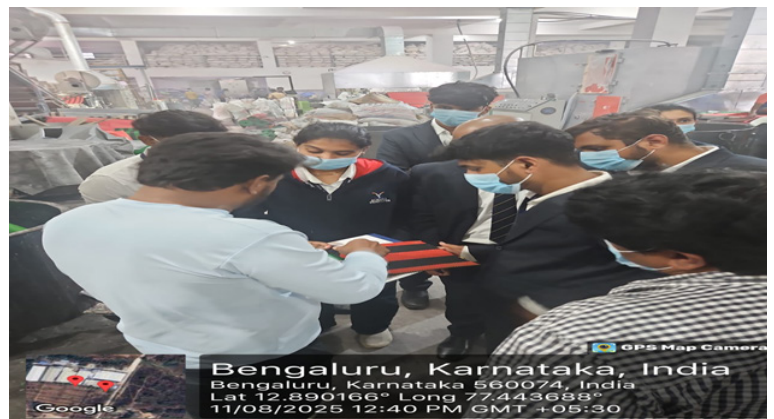


Industrial Visit to Polytruf India Pvt. Ltd. Offers MBA Students Insight into Modern Manufacturing

Educational Visit to Visvesvaraya Museum Broadens Aviation Students' Horizons

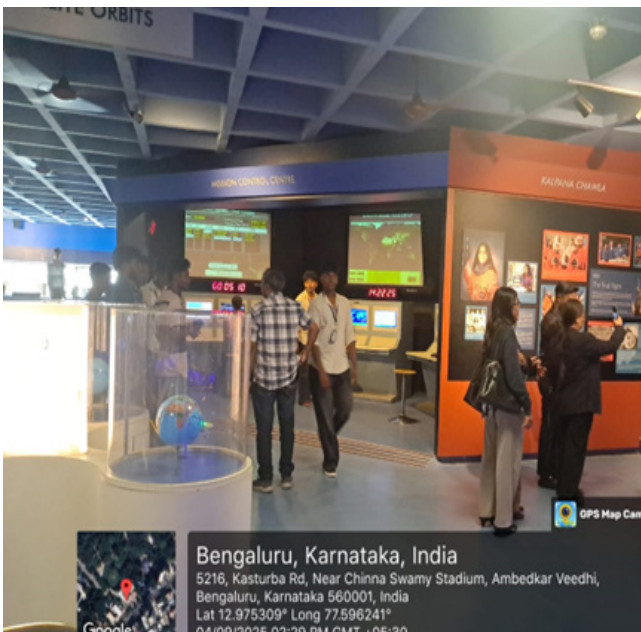

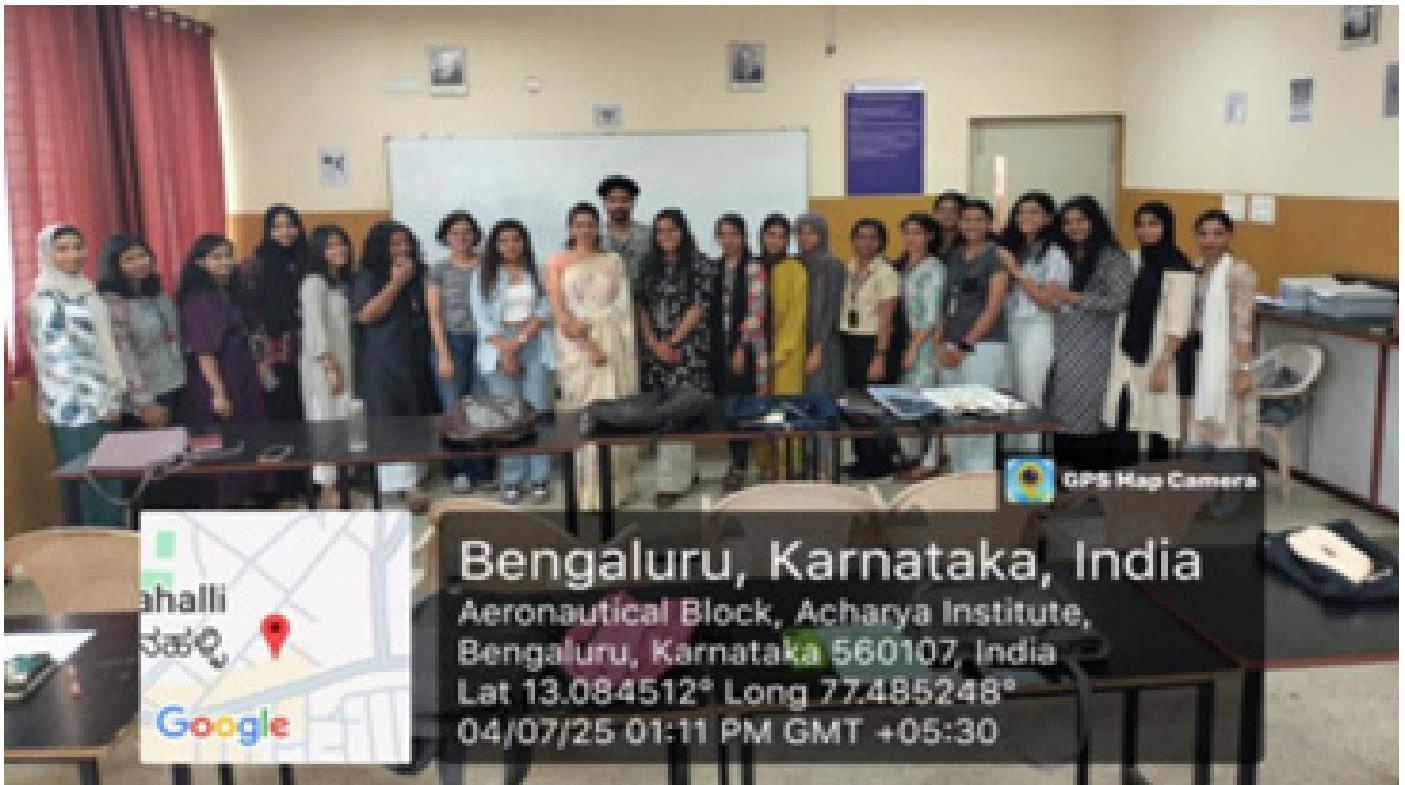
