HOSTELS

All students who have pre-booked the hostel shall be accommodated in their assigned rooms on arrival. Students who have not pre-booked the hostel will be accommodated in the guest room. As the guest rooms are limited, this facility cannot be availed for more than 48hrs (2 nights) during which either they can choose to stay in the hostel by paying the prescribed fee or shift to private accommodation.

REPORTING TO COLLEGE

Student has to report to the International Admissions Office on the second day of arrival in India along with all the documents to complete the joining formalities. Hostel Warden will guide you to the international students office as per the reporting slot allotted to you.

FRRO (FOREIGNER REGIONAL REGISTRATION OFFICE)

Foreign National Passport holders (Except Bhutan & Nepal) have to register with FRRO within 14 days of arrival in India to get the Residential Permit. For details click on <http://www.boi.gov.in>.

The International student support officer shall will assist in FRRO appointment and registration. Students who wish to stay in private accommodation have to enter into a legal agreement with the landlord and the same has to be submitted to the international officer within a week of your arrival. Submit the rental agreement by 5th day of arrival. Students who have not submitted the required documents within the stipulated time cannot be register with the FFRO within 14 days. Any fine or additional fee for the delay has to be paid by the students.

Bengaluru

ABOUT BENGALURU

Bengaluru is the capital of the Indian province state of Karnataka. A bustling IT hub, this vibrant city is known also as the Silicon Valley of India. Located on the Deccan Plateau in the south -eastern part of Karnataka.

HISTORY

The term 'Bengaluru' is an anglicized version of "Bengalooru," a Kannada term, derived from the phrase 'bend a kaalu oorū', meaning 'the town of boiled beans'. This name was given by King Veera Bhalla (the 2nd) of the Hoysala dynasty, in 1120. Kempe Gowda laid the foundation of the city. Kannada is the language spoken in Bengaluru and Karnataka. Kannada Rajyotsava is widely celebrated on 1 November and is a public holiday in the city, to mark the formation of Karnataka state on 1 November 1956. Bengaluru balances the old and the new in an incredibly good manner. As multinational's aim for the sky with spiraling workplaces all around Bengaluru, Some of the most beautiful gardens in the country & a monumental palace, which was once the summer retreat of the great warrior Tipu Sultan, adorn the city and add to the cultural heritage. Bengaluru is also famous for its youthful vibe & pub culture. From interesting historical structures to the most modernistic lifestyle, Bengaluru is fascinating, to say the least. Bengaluru has domestic and International airport that connects most of the major cities of the country and the world

CLIMATE

Bengaluru located at an altitude of 920m (3021 ft) from the sea level, Bengaluru has a moderate and pleasant climate throughout the year. During summer the temperature reach a maximum of 34° C and winters with 15° C. Bengaluru enjoys both southwest and northeast monsoons.



LANDMARK: PLACES TO SEE IN BENGALURU

Bengaluru Palace- A scenic palace which bears striking resemblance to England's Windsor Castle, Bengaluru Palace is a scenic tourist hotspot with a majestic castle-like structure set amidst lush green environs.

Lal Bagh - Lal Bagh is the most famous tourist attraction in Bengaluru and is spread out over 240 acres. The botanical garden was built in the 18th century during the reign of Hyder Ali and his son Tipu Sultan. This enchanting garden has preserved some of the rarest species of flora and fauna and also houses a lake and a glasshouse Vidhan Soudha - This is one of the most important structures in Bengaluru. The 46-metre tall imposing building comprises 300 rooms, each of which reflects the impressive Dravidian style of architecture. Housing 22 departments of the Government of Karnataka, Vidhan Soudha also happens to be one of the one of the largest legislative buildings and is a mustsee tourist attraction in Bengaluru.

Attara Kacheri (High Court) - "Eighteen offices" is the literal meaning of this very elegant two storied building facing Vidhana far from there is the sprawling Cubbon Park, Vishveshwaraya Museum of Science and Technology and Venkatappa Art Gallery.

Cubbon Park- This beautiful park showcases more than 6,000 species of trees and plants, along with famous statues and well-planned avenues spread out over an area of 300 acres. Cubbon Park is frequented by nature lovers as well as those who wish to explore the magnificent landscaping and architecture of this park situated right in the heart of Bengaluru city.

Bannerghatta National Park- Situated in the middle of the forests in the valley of the famous Champakadhama hills. The Bannerghatta National Park, a rich natural zoological reserve, works towards conservation of wildlife and promotes responsible wildlife tourism. It comprises a zoo, safari, butterfly park and rescue center that carries out conservation and rehabilitation of orphaned animals. The animals of the park are provided with an ambience that allows them to live in harmony with nature.



ISKCON Sri Radha Krishnachandra Temple- The Rad ha Krishnachandra Temple in Bengaluru has idols of Radha and Krishna and is one of the largest ISKCON temples in the world. Inaugurated in 1997, the temple promotes Vedic culture and spiritual learning. The temple attracts people from across the world and offers a truly peaceful experience to its visitors.

St. Mark's Cathedral- Founded in 1808 and consecrated in 1816, St. Mark's Cathedral is located on the popular M.G. Road in Bengaluru. The cathedral is built in old colonial style architecture, with a beautiful dome over a semicircular chancel and Roman arches decorating the walls. It was built along the lines of the 17th-century St Pauls Cathedral. The delicate woodwork, carvings and stained glasswork add to the beauty of the church.

Bull Temple- The Bull Temple or Dodda Basavana Gudi in Basavanagudi is devoted to Nandi Bull, the vahana or vehicle of Lord Shiva. Built in the 16th century in Dravidian style architecture, the temple is one of the oldest temples in Bengaluru. The temple has one of the biggest idols of Nandi in granite - measuring about 15 feet in height and 20 feet in length. Legend has it that this temple was built to appease a bull that used to devour and destroy all the ground nuts and peanuts cultivated in this area. It is believed that after the temple was built, the bull stopped hampering the crop. To celebrate this, the farmers organized a Groundnut Fair (Kadalekai Parase) near the temple and offer groundnut to the deity. This fair is still held and attended by people from neighbouring areas.

Dodda Ganesha Temple - Dodda Ganesha Temple, a popular landmark of Bengaluru, is located just next to the Bull Temple close to Bugle Rock Park. The Ganesha idol here is 18 feet tall and 16 feet wide. The idol is decorated in different ways during the week and one of the most popular attractions is when idol is coated with butter (Benne Alankara). It is said that more than 1 00 kg of butter is needed to apply on the idol. The temple attracts many devotees from all over Bengaluru.



Jawahar Lal Nehru Planetarium - The Jawaharlal Nehru Planetarium is a fascinating facility for non-formal science education. It is administered by the Bengaluru Association for Science Education (BASE), which has also established a Science Centre in the Planetarium. The Planetarium has a 15-metre diameter dome and a seating capacity of 210. It has a projector that was installed in 1989. There are also about 200 smaller projectors that simulate the night sky for a given date, time and place.

The primary goal of the centre is to impart quality education and nurture creative talents in science to enable students at all levels to pursue a career in research and teaching.

Gavi Gangadhareshwara Temple - The ancient Gavi Gangadhareshwara Temple dedicated to Lord Shiva is a great example of the Indian rock-cut architecture. Believed to have been built around the 9th century, the temple was cut out of a monolithic rock. The deity in the main shrine is a Shivalinga. Apart from this, there is also Nandi sculpture in the front of the temple and a rare idol of Agni, the God of fire. Also known as Gavipuram Cave Temple, a fascinating characteristic of the temple are its mysterious stone discs in the forecourt and the precise planning that allows the sun to shine on shrine in certain time of the year. Makar Sankranti, which is held in the middle of January every year, is a special day for the temple when thousands of devotees come here. This is the day when sunrays fall on the Shivalinga for one hour as it passes between the horns of Nandi. This proves how advanced the architecture and astronomy of the ancient sculptors was as they could craft the horns of the stone bull outside the temple in a way that the sun's rays would pass through its horns and light up the Shivalinga inside the cave. The sun is supposed to illuminate the Shivalinga two times every year - from 13 to 16 January in late afternoons and from 26 November to 2 December.

National Gallery of Modern Art - The National Gallery of Modern Art in Bengaluru is located in the grand Manikyavelu Mansion on Palace Road, which was once the property of the Mysore royal family. The heritage building is now a modern museum with a refurbished auditorium, an open air theatre, a library, offices and art storage, a cafeteria, and a museum shop cum facilitations block. The gallery has an impressive collection of India's changing art forms over the last 150 years starting from about 1857.

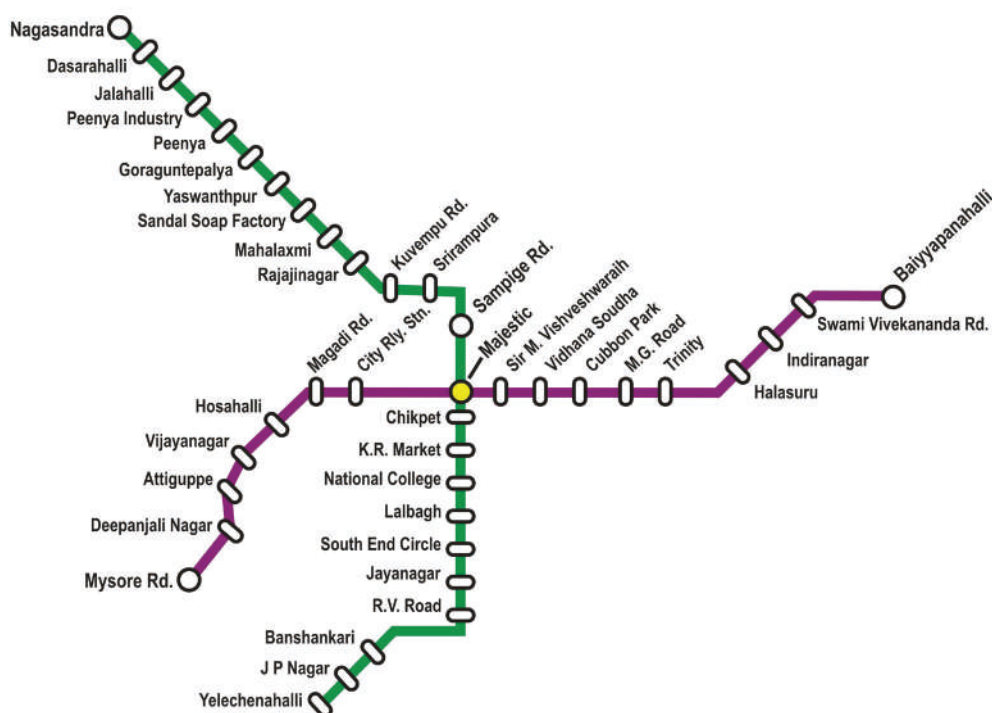
