Objectives:

The main objectives of organizing the health screening camp were:

- To promote the importance of regular health check-ups among students and support staff and create awareness about preventive healthcare and early detection of health issues.
- To offer accessible healthcare services to those who may not have easy access to routine medical evaluations.
- To provide NSS volunteers with an opportunity to engage in community service and develop organizational skills.

Program Introduction:

On the occasion of International Women's Day, the NSS Unit of Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies (AIGS) organized a Comprehensive Health Screening Camp on 27th March 2026. The event was coordinated under the leadership of Mr. George Varied T, NSS Program Officer, with active participation from 33 NSS volunteers. The camp aimed to provide holistic healthcare services to the institutional community and create awareness about preventive health measures.

The program witnessed enthusiastic participation from students, faculty members, housekeeping staff, security personnel, and supporting departments. Along with health screening, a blood donation camp was also conducted to encourage humanitarian service. The initiative reflected the NSS Unit's commitment to promoting health, wellness, and social responsibility.

Theme of the Event: *COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH SCREENING CAMP.*

Detailed Report:

A Comprehensive Health Screening Camp was organized by the NSS Unit, AIGS on 27th March 2026, Friday in association with Dhanwantari Hospital, Chikkabanawara. The camp began at 9:30 AM and continued till 4:00 PM, covering a wide range of diagnostic services. Doctors and specialists from Dhanwantari Hospital were present from departments including:

- General Medicine
- Gynecology
- Dentists
- Optometrists

A team of trained nurses and technicians conducted basic health checkups such as:

- Vitals assessment
- Blood pressure (BP)
- Blood sugar levels
- Saturation levels
- Eye screening

The Comprehensive Health Screening Camp commenced in the morning with registration facilitated by NSS volunteers. A total of 38 volunteers worked systematically under the guidance of Mr. George Varied T, NSS Program Officer, ensuring smooth coordination and participant flow. The camp included multiple screening stations where general health parameters such as height, weight, oxygen saturation, blood pressure, and blood sugar were assessed.

Doctors from the departments of General Medicine, Gynaecology, and Dental conducted consultations, providing participants with guidance on preventive healthcare and lifestyle modifications. An eye screening camp was also conducted by optometrists, where participants were evaluated for vision problems, and spectacles were provided at subsidized rates.

In addition to health screening, a blood donation camp was organized as part of the initiative. The response was encouraging, with 28 donors voluntarily donating blood, contributing to the noble cause of saving lives. Overall, approximately 283 participants, including students, teaching and non-teaching staff, housekeeping, security, and supporting staff, benefited from the camp.

The NSS volunteers played a significant role in registration, smooth crowd management, guiding participants, coordinating with the medical team, and maintaining discipline. The NSS volunteers also

This drive has inspired the whole team to organize similar events on a regular basis to ensure a better health among the students and staff in Acharya Institutes.
