### Objectives:

1. To promote awareness about the importance of voluntary blood donation and its role in saving lives.
2. To encourage students, faculty, and staff to become regular voluntary blood donors and contribute to the community.
3. To foster a sense of social responsibility, humanitarian values, and service through active participation in the blood donation drive.

### Program Introduction:

The Youth Red Cross Unit of Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies, in association with the Indian Red Cross Society, Karnataka State Branch, organized a Blood Donation Camp on 31 July 2026 at the AIGS Block. The camp provided a safe and well-organized platform for eligible donors to participate in this humanitarian initiative under the supervision of qualified medical professionals.

### **Theme of the Event:**

“Be a hero, Save a life, Donate Blood.”

### **Detailed Report:**

The Youth Red Cross (YRC) Unit of Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies, in association with the Indian Red Cross Society, Karnataka State Branch, successfully organized a Blood Donation Camp on 31 July 2026 at the AIGS Block. The programme was conducted with the objective of promoting voluntary blood donation, creating awareness about the importance of blood donation, and encouraging students, faculty, and staff to participate in this noble humanitarian initiative.

The programme commenced with an inaugural session attended by the institution's dignitaries, Youth Red Cross Programme Officers, representatives from the Indian Red Cross Society, faculty members, and students. During the inaugural address, the speakers highlighted the importance of voluntary blood donation in saving lives and emphasized that a single unit of donated blood can save up to three lives. Participants were also educated about the safety of the blood donation process and the continuous need for voluntary donors to maintain an adequate blood supply for hospitals and emergency medical care.

The medical team from the Indian Red Cross, Karnataka conducted the blood donation camp by following all standard medical protocols. Every volunteer underwent a preliminary health screening, including checks for haemoglobin level, blood pressure, weight, age, and overall fitness. Only medically eligible individuals were permitted to donate blood, ensuring the safety and well-being of both donors and recipients.

The camp witnessed an encouraging response from students, teaching faculty, and non-teaching staff. A total of 75 volunteers came forward with the willingness to donate blood. After the mandatory medical screening, 69 eligible donors successfully donated blood, while the remaining volunteers were advised not to donate due to medical reasons or eligibility criteria. The Youth Red Cross volunteers efficiently managed the registration process, guided participants, coordinated with the medical team, and ensured the smooth conduct of the programme. Donors were provided with refreshments and post-donation care instructions after completing the donation.

The programme concluded with a vote of thanks expressing gratitude to the Indian Red Cross Society, Karnataka State Branch, the institution's management, faculty members, volunteers, and all the donors for their wholehearted support and participation. The Blood Donation Camp was a great success,
