Dr. Ramesh B Kudenatti provided clarification on BBA & BBA in Aviation courses under SEP & recommended to encourage publication and to develop inhouse projects to enhance research culture.

Mr. B.K. Nagaraj recommended exploring industrial applications for research and development within the Chemistry Department. He also highlighted the presence of several untapped research areas that the department can further develop.

Mr. Mahanandeesha Hallur suggested steam therapy and gene therapy as potential focus areas for research under the Chemistry Department. The Member Secretary updated the council that management is working on quantum computing.
