DETAILED REPORT:

After the completion of their rounds, the second and third-year cadets also took part in the drill competition, allowing them to demonstrate their improved drill standards and teamwork. The final event of the day was the relay race- (4 x 400m), which added an element of excitement and physical challenge. Cadets from all four groups competed with energy and sportsmanship, encouraging one another and contributing to the overall spirit of unity. 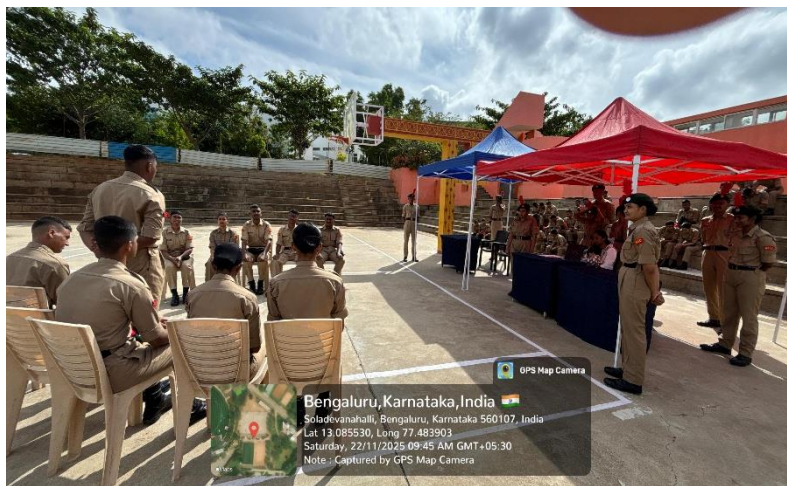

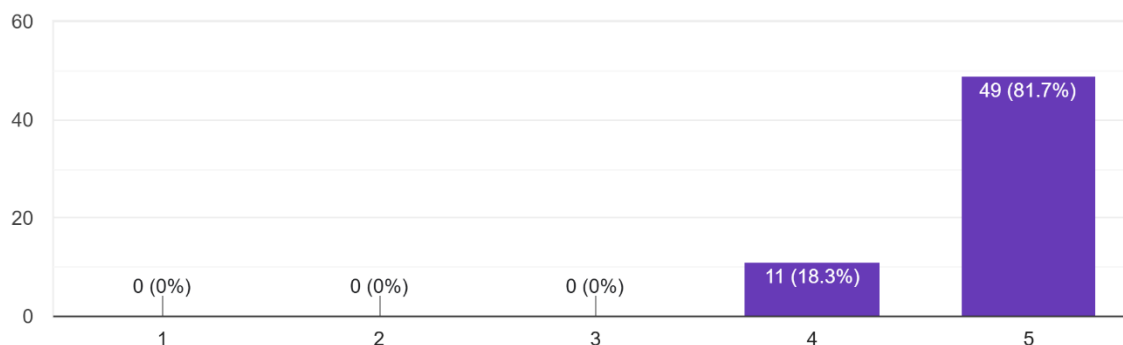

1. How satisfied are you with the overall NCC Day event on a scale of 1 to 5?

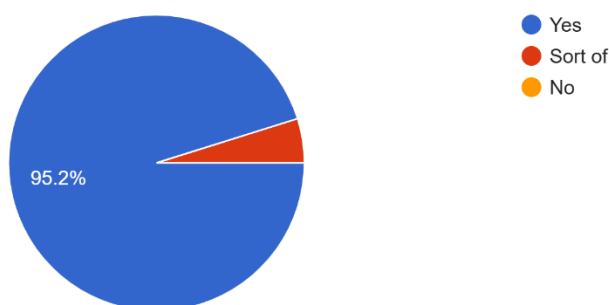
60 responses

2. Did you receive clear instructions before each event?

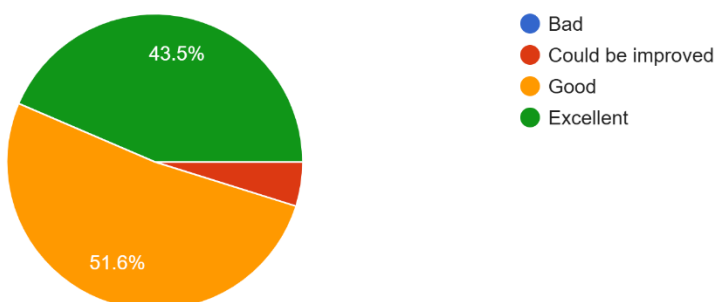
62 responses

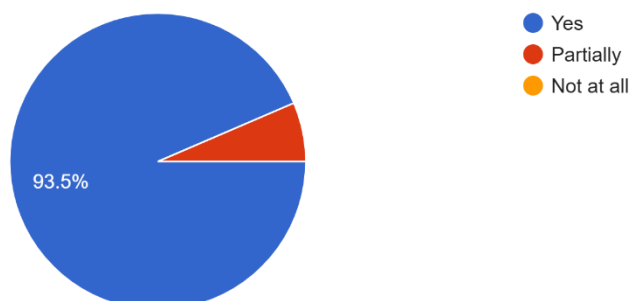

4. Did you feel motivated and encouraged throughout the event?

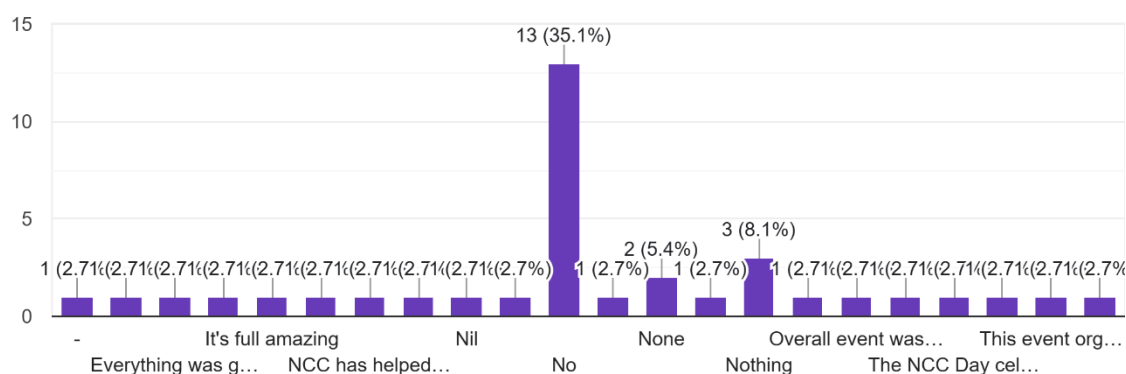
62 responses
