

Were the instructions for the quiz clear and easy to follow?


12 responses

How would you rate the difficulty level of the quiz questions?


12 responses

33.3% of the participants found the event to be excellently organized, 58.3% thought it was Very Good and only 8.3% of them thought it was Good.



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


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Would you like more such knowledge-based events in NCC?
