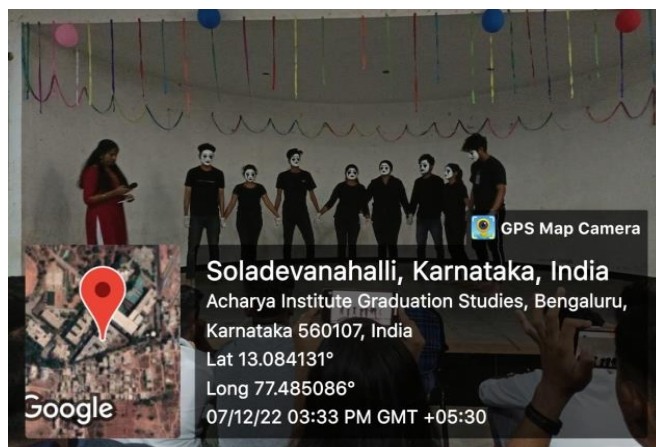
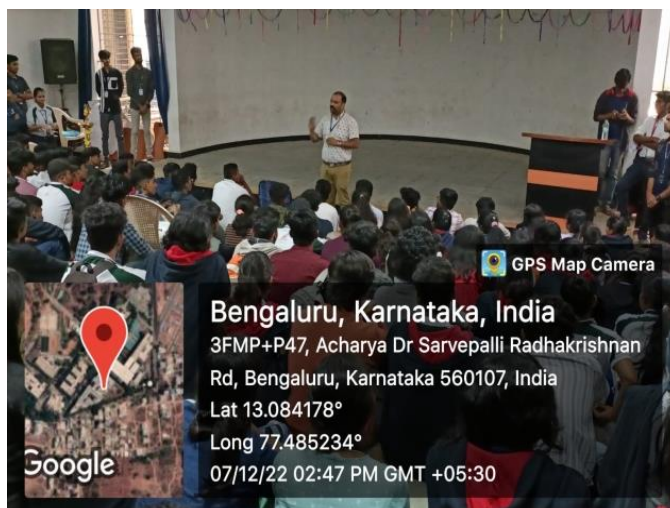


NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

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Awareness and Blood Donation Drive held on 21st December 2022

A voluntary blood donation drive was organized by the NSS unit of AIGS in collaboration with LIONS Blood Bank and Bowring Hospital Blood bank on the 21st December 2022. The objectives of the blood donation drive were:

1. Involving the NSS volunteers and donors together for the cause of saving human lives.
2. Prepare a registry to meet blood requirements in future. Through this patients are able to receive the lifesaving blood they urgently need.

The volunteers were divided into many groups and the awareness team had visited every class in AIGS from 15th Dec onwards creating awareness about the need and benefits of blood donation, do and don'ts of blood donation and clearing the misconceptions. The awareness talks about blood donation and its benefits, precautions before donating blood were explained to all the students of AIGS by Mr. George, NSS Program Officer and active NSS volunteers which would clear the doubts of the student donors thereby motivating them to be a part of the noble cause and preparing them for the process. On 20th December, a flash mob was performed by the NSS volunteers to spread awareness and announce about the drive for the whole campus.

Like all other years, the camp turned to be a grand success by collecting 212 units of blood on a whole, 147 units by LIONS Blood bank and 65 units by Bowring and Lady Curzon Hospital Blood bank. Around 90 NSS volunteers controlled the whole mob and the program concluded without any casualties. Finally, a memento and appreciation certificates were presented by LIONS Club as well as Bowring and Lady Curzon Hospital Blood bank to Dr. Gurunath Rao Vaidya, Principal, AIGS as a token of appreciation. The Principal addressed the gathering and appreciated the efforts of bringing out a successful camp in a very organized manner. The LIONS club of Peenya Dasarhalli had distributed caps for all the volunteers as a token of appreciation and they congratulated the team under the leadership of Dr. Mirshad Rahman for organizing the drive without any flaws. The LIONS club members also thanked the Principal for being supportive and Mr. George, NSS Program Officer for constantly organizing such drives from 2011 which has helped saving many lives. ROAD SAFETY WEEK AND AWARENESS PROGRAM on 9th January 2023

On the occasion of the Road Safety Week from 11th to 17th January 2023, the NSS unit of AIGS in association with SAKKHI - a women empowerment organization had organized a road safety awareness program on 9th January 2023, Monday at 1pm in Seminar hall, EEE Block. The Chief Guest for the session was Dr. Suresh, Retd. Chief Warden, BCP Traffic Warden Organization and the keynote speaker was Mr. Jayanth Garudachar, Former Assistant Chief Warden, BCP Traffic Warden Organization. The guests of honor were Shri. Rajalakshmi, Founder, V SAKKHI and Shri. Nochur Girija, Coordinator at SAKKHI.

The objectives of the program were:

- To provide road safety information for road users to encourage safer road user behaviour among current and prospective road users and reduce the number of accidents.
- To make people aware of the safety measures to be followed on road

Traffic safety education is meant to provide the students with lifetime skills for maneuvering in the public roads and highways. The importance of learning these skills at college level is increasing, since more and more students are nowadays driving and all of these kinds of students need to be provided with education on their safety and the safety of other road users when they are on the road.



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The mission is to educate, improve driving behaviors and raise awareness of the deadly epidemic of distracted driving. The program was conducted to instill a sense of responsibility and make the students aware of road safety and the rules and regulations to be followed.

The event started at 1pm with a welcome speech was delivered by Srilakshmi, NSS volunteer followed by the lamp lighting ceremony by the chief guests and the NSS officer along with NSS volunteers. The session started with the address by the Chief Guest Dr. B. Sureshkumar who spoke about the need for creating awareness on road safety and the roles each citizen needs to play. Dr Suresh also spoke about the voluntary service rendered by himself and the whole Traffic warden organization in bringing in more discipline and safety on the roads. Later the session was taken over by Mr. Jayanth Garudachar, who with the help of a ppt and good amount of interaction and questioning explained the measures to improve road safety. He also reminded about the road safety rules and also with help of videos showed the consequences of neglecting the road rules which could end up in accidents and deaths of many. The session went upto 1 hour with good interaction as well as clarification of doubts from the gathering.

Shri. Rajalakshmi spoke few words about the objective of promoting road safety by V SAKKHI and Shri. Girija also shared her personal experience which made her to take up this initiative of creating awareness in schools and colleges. Towards the end of the session, a short movie on the importance of following road safety rules prepared by NSS alumni was screened which was appreciated by the audience the chief guests. The whole team of around 150 NSS volunteers took an oath to follow the road safety rules and they received their certificate for the same by the Govt. of Karnataka. The program ended with a concluding note by Mr. George, NSS Program Officer and vote of thanks by Dakshayini. The whole team dispersed after National Anthem.

The program was a huge success with good number of participants meeting the objectives and thereby imparting information to the students about traffic rules and safety measures on the road.

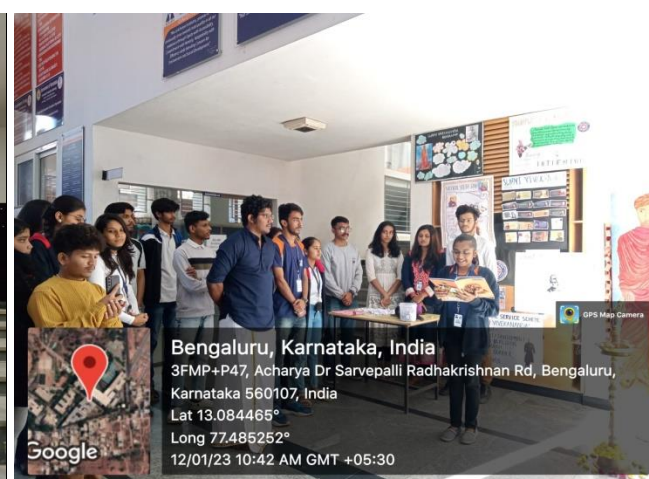

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YOGATHON 2023

The Department of Youth Empowerment and Sports, Department of Education and the Government of Karnataka along with NSS and NCC Units had jointly organized the 3rd Yogathon 2023 on 15th January 2023 at 6am. The NSS Cell, BCU had also been a part of the program and had invited all NSS Units under BCU to be a part of the Guinness World Record (GWR) attempt under Project Yogathon2023 which happened at Sree Kanteerava Stadium, Bengaluru. Across 35+ locations in Karnataka – the Youth established a new record adding to the pride of Karnataka.

The mass yoga drill was organized by the Department of Sports and Youth Empowerment, Karnataka. This event saw a record number of over six lakh participants, in Bengaluru on January 15, 2023. Governor Thaavarchand Gehlot and Sports and Youth Empowerment Minister K. C. Narayana Gowda participated in the event. Mr. Gowda stated in a release that the earlier record had been held by Rajasthan, where about 1.5 lakh people had participated in a yogathon. He expressed happiness over his department’s achievement.

The Yogathon is a program by the Karnataka Government to keep citizens fit and healthy. The program has a lot of benefits, like decreasing the risk of cardiovascular diseases and reducing stress. One of the main reasons why people take part in this program is because it is one of the cheapest and easiest ways to get fit. The best way to have a healthy lifestyle is to incorporate fitness and yoga into your daily routine. This is the idea behind the Yogathon, which is the state’s largest yoga and health movement event.

85 NSS volunteers along with Mr. George V T, NSS Program Officer had been a part of the Yogathon 2023. The program started at 6:00 am in Kanteerava stadium where all the NSS volunteers assembled near the entrance. Later the NSS volunteers from AIGS were called for controlling the crowd and support the organizing team in distributing jerseys for the participants. After the welcome addresses by the guests, all the volunteers were asked to follow the yoga practices which were explained with demonstration. All the NSS volunteers had actively participated in the event and after completion of the yoga practices, they were asked to help in serving food for the participants. On a

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whole the program ended by 9:30 am and after having refreshments, the team took group photos and dispersed by 10.30am.

The event turned to hold a place in Guinness World Record, since it involved 10,000 Yoga trainers and up to 10 lakh yoga wellness volunteers across all districts of the state as a part of National Youth festival -2023. It was a great moment of pride for the NSS team to be a part of such a mega event not merely by participating but also supporting the organizers in managing the crowd. The event was a great learning experience for the volunteers to know the Yoga practices and also felt satisfied being a support team for the program to function to happen smoothly.

EXTENSION ACTIVITY on ROAD SAFETY at Acharya Institutes - 20th January 2023

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On the occasion of the Road Safety Week from 11th to 17th January 2023, the NSS unit of AIGS organised a Road Safety Awareness programme on 20th January, 2023. The programme was executed in the form of dance, mime and a speech which was performed in three locations across the Acharya campus from 12 pm onwards. The aim of the programme was to propagate the Road Safety education received by the NSS volunteers to the students of AIGS and Acharya Institutes during the Road Safety Week observed from 11th - 17th January.

The objectives of the program were:

- To provide road safety information for road users to encourage safer road user behaviour among current and prospective road users and reduce the number of accidents.
- To make people aware of the safety measures to be followed on road

Today road transport is an integral part of life and everyone in one form or another is a road user. The present transport system has minimized the distances but it has, on the other hand increased the risk to life. In India itself about eighty thousand people are killed in road crashes every year which is thirteen percent of the total fatality all over the world. Man behind the wheel plays an important role in most of the crashes and in most of the cases crashes occurs either due to carelessness or lack of road safety awareness. Hence, road safety education is as essential as any other basic skills of survival. The program was conducted to instill a sense of responsibility and make the students aware of road safety and the rules and regulations to be followed.

The event started at 12 noon on 20th January 2023 where the team had initially started with a small dance performance to grab the attention of the gathering and later moved on to the mime act with

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insightful messages in every scene portrayed and ended with a summarising speech by Shriram. The mime covered basic safety measures such as wearing helmets, dangers of triple seating on a two-wheeler, wearing seatbelts, avoiding distracted or intoxicated driving and also emphasized on the importance of time management as riding in a hurry itself would be a possible cause of road accidents. There was also an emphasis on inculcating a culture of responsible driving and also respecting others on the road by giving them space when required. This performance was initially exhibited in front of AIGS at 12 noon and later in front of Acharya Main Gate at 12.45pm and the last performance was in front of OYA café at 1.15pm. At the end of every performance, Shriram would educate the public with the scenario about road accidents and also emphasize on following of road rules for everyone’s safety. The programme was coordinated and directed by Shahanshah, senior NSS volunteer under the guidance of Mr. George, NSS Program Officer.

The NSS team took pride on this event as the objectives were met and also felt happy to use the education received to spread awareness and educate people on Road Safety.

The event was really interactive and the students enjoyed

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the session. The Gram panchayat president R Kiran Kumar appreciated the program and invited the NSS team to do a traffic awareness program in the kaskatapura grand function. The NSS Unit organized an awareness program on CANCER: ITS EARLY DETECTION AND PREVENTION for all the students and faculty members of AIGS on 10th February 2023 at 11am in Seminar Hall, ANA Block. The awareness program was organized in association with SPARSH HOSPITAL, Yeshwanthpur on the occasion of World Cancer Day which was on 4th Feb 2023. The awareness program was coordinated by Mr. George V T, NSS Program Officer along with the NSS team. The chief guest and resource person for the session was Dr. Sushruta Mysore Shankar who is a Consultant, Breast & Surgical Oncology department at SPARSH HOSPITAL, Yeshwanthpur.



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Creating cancer awareness among the general public promotes cancer prevention and routine screening which will ensure early detection and assure better treatment outcomes. This will ultimately reduce the cancer burden in the country. Keeping these objectives, the NSS Unit had organized the awareness program on 10th February 2023. On 4th Feb 2023, the NSS Unit had observed the WORLD CANCER DAY by putting up awareness and informative charts in the lobby thereby making the students and faculty members aware the importance of the day.
