OBJECTIVES:

1. To raise awareness about the detrimental effects of plastic and inspire collective action to combat this global crisis.
2. To reduce the use of single use plastic and educate on proper plastic waste disposal
3. To inform and encourage usage of eco-friendly replacements to plastic products.

INTRODUCTION:

THEME OF THE EVENT: "BEAT THE PLASTIC POLLUTION"

The world is being inundated by plastic. More than 400 million tons of plastic is produced every year, half of which is designed to be used only once. The theme for World Environment Day on 5 June 2023 focused on solutions to plastic pollution under the campaign #BeatPlasticPollution.

DETAILED REPORT:

The NSS unit (AIGS) organized an awareness programme on the theme #beat the plastic pollution on World Environment Day, June 5 2023 in Acharya Institute of Graduate Studies. The NSS volunteers formed three teams consisting of 5 to 6 members each to deliver a 5 to 10-minute awareness talk and oath taking for all the students of AIGS.

The main agenda of the awareness program was to educate the audience about plastic pollution creating awareness on the seriousness of this global issue, encourage the audience to reduce their use of plastic by promoting eco-friendly alternative such as reusable bags and containers and to inform about the proper disposal methods to protect our environment. Audience was asked to share their initiatives which could be carried out by others to reduce plastic pollution. They were also suggested to use clothes bags, high density plastic bottles, ink pens, non-plastic home décors and so on. Further safer resin codes of plastic (2,4 and 5) were informed to the audience to help them distinguish between recyclable and non-recyclable plastic. Besides, NSS volunteers also shared the awareness video made on the theme for the day.

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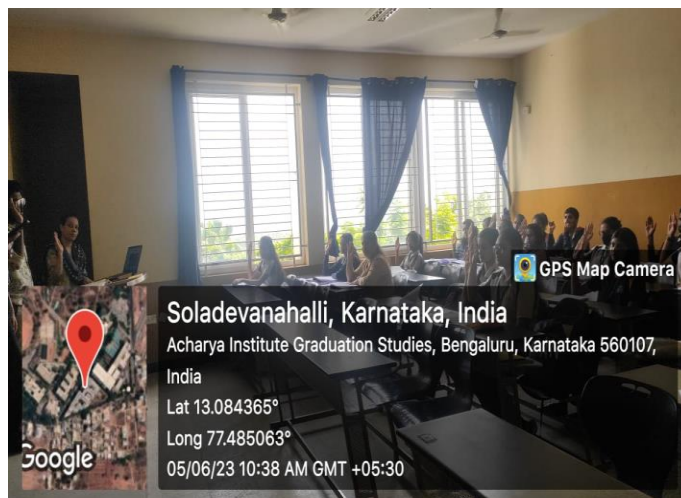

DETAILED REPORT

The NSS Unit of AIGS had organized a Drug Awareness program on the occasion of the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking on 26th June 2023. The chief guest and resource person for the awareness program was Shri. Shivakumar Devaraju, IPS (DCP North Division, Bengaluru). Along with the resource person, Mr. Gowtham J, CI, Soladevanahalli Police Station and many other police officials had been a part of the program. Our Principal, Dr. Gurunath Rao Vaidya, Shri. C.B.M Bhooshan, ES to Chairman and Mr. Ramakrishna Gowda, General Administrator were also present for the awareness programme which witnessed more than 260 students and faculty members.

The International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking is celebrated on June 26th every year. By resolution 42/112 of 7 December 1987, the General Assembly decided to observe 26 June as the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking as an expression of its determination to strengthen action and cooperation to achieve the goal of an international society free of drug abuse.



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The International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, or World Drug Day, is marked on 26 June every year to strengthen action and cooperation in achieving a world free of drug abuse. The theme for 2023 was **"People First: stop stigma and Discrimination, strengthen Prevention,"** with the aim of raising awareness about the importance of treating people who use drugs with respect and empathy; providing evidence-based, voluntary services for all; offering alternatives to punishment; prioritizing prevention; and leading with compassion. The campaign also aims to combat stigma and discrimination against people who use drugs by promoting language and attitudes that are respectful and non-judgmental.

The event started at 11am in the main auditorium on arrival of the chief guests and the emceeing was handled by Sinchana Gopinath, NSS volunteer who delivered the welcome speech and introduction of the guests. Later Shri Bhooshan addressed the gathering who threw light on the importance of creating awareness in the campus and the steps to be taken by the youth to beat the usage of drugs. Later the session was taken over by the resource person, Shri Devaraju who spoke about the bad effects of drug abuse and the issues faced by the society due to drug abusers. Devaraju sir spoke for an hour where he also covered the legal aspects of the drug induced crimes and how it could affect the student life if they were indulged in such offenses. The session was very informative and rather helped in meeting with the objectives of the program and there was a good amount of interaction from the audience by asking lot of questions. Devaraju sir could clarify all the doubts and emphasizing on the point that drugs is a social nuisance and it has to be eradicated. The session ended with an oath by all the participants where the oath was read out by Shrilakshmi, NSS volunteer.

Before ending the session there was a musical Skit performed by the NSS team lead by Meenakshi on how drugs affect ones' life and to come out of it with social support and the NCC cadets had also performed a mime led by Cdt. Ebitta Sibi which showed the crimes that could be caused by excessive drug abuse. Both the performances were highly appreciated by the audience and the overall program created an impact on the student minds. Many awareness posters prepared by the NSS volunteers were put across at the venue as well as in AIGS block.

CONCLUSION

Both the students and faculties had a great session and the NSS Unit was successful in meeting the objectives of the program by creating awareness about Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. The program ended on a positive note from the officials who were happy with the way the program was organised.

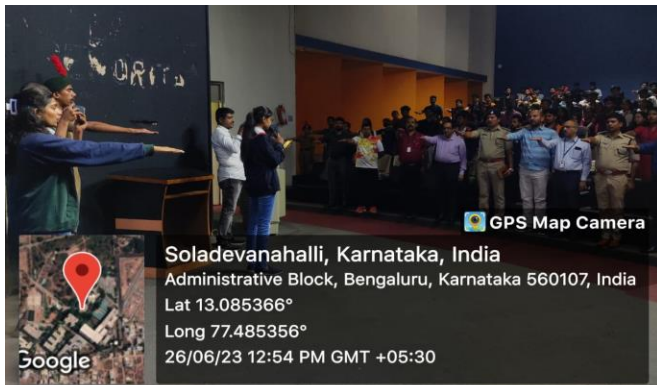

Objectives:

- To educate PG students on the significance of voting and the impact of their vote.
- To motivate students to actively participate in upcoming elections.
- To foster a sense of civic duty and responsibility among the students.
- To have students take an oath committing to exercise their right to vote

Program Introduction: The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of AIGS organized a Voting Awareness Program and Oath Taking drive for Postgraduate (PG) students on 6th March 2024. The event aimed to educate students about the importance of voting, encourage active participation in the democratic process, and instill a sense of civic responsibility.

Theme of the Event: *"I VOTE FOR SURE"*.

The Collaborators for the event - Electoral Committee, AIGS

Detailed Report:

The event was planned with the collaboration of the NSS team, AIGS Electoral Club, and local election authorities. The event took place from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM and comprised of awareness talk in each class related to the importance of voting, and why as responsible citizens they should vote which was followed by oath taking by the students. All the students were asked to register in MYGOV platform where they would be receiving a certificate for the pledge taken. All attendees participated in taking a solemn oath to exercise their right to vote and encourage others to do the same. Over 200 PG students attended the event and all attendees took an oath, committing to vote in the upcoming elections.

Students gained a better understanding of the electoral process and the importance of voting. Students appreciated the informative sessions and expressed a greater resolve to participate in elections. The

program successfully motivated many students to register to vote and participate in elections. The oath-taking ceremony reinforced the importance of civic duties among students. NSS Volunteers felt happy about the initiative and the enthusiasm shown by the students.

Outcomes:

- The primary outcome was encouraging widespread participation among students and first-time voters in the electoral process, addressing historical voter apathy in the youth demographic.
- The events successfully disseminated information about the importance of voting, voter registration procedures, and the process of casting a ballot, especially for new voters.
- The administration of the "Voter's Pledge" ("We, the citizens of India, having abiding faith in democracy, hereby pledge to uphold the democratic traditions...") served as a symbolic commitment from participants to exercise their democratic rights and responsibilities.

The "Voting Awareness and Oath Taking" drive on March 6th was a crucial component of a comprehensive, multi-faceted national effort to foster a robust culture of democracy and civic responsibility among young and first-time voters.

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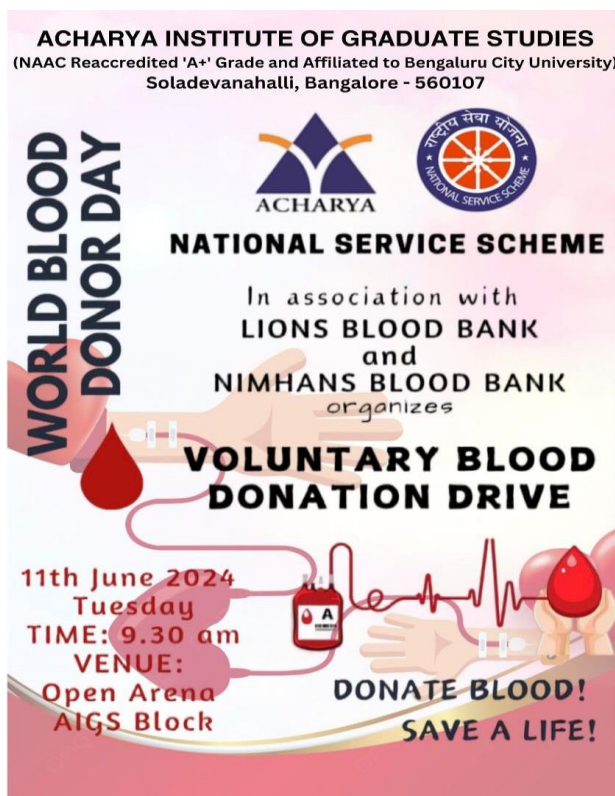
